The Board is considering some equipment upgrades, repairs,



### AMATEUR RADIO IN SPACE: HAMS INVITED TO LISTEN FOR NEW SATELLITES

Five research satellites were carried to orbit on November 19 aboard a Minotaur V rocket from Kodiak Island, Alaska. All the satellites use Amateur Radio frequencies and hams have been invited to participate in their missions by monitoring and collecting data.

Two of the satellites are FASTRACs -- relatively small "nanosatellites" -- built by students at The University of Texas in Austin. They enter orbit as a single spacecraft, but then separate into FASTRAC 1 (known as "Sara Lily") and FASTRAC 2 (referred to as "Emma"). Both satellites use 1200 or 9600 baud AX.25 digital communication and transmit at 1 W output, so they should be receivable with omnidirectional VHF or UHF antennas and decodable by ordinary packet radio hardware and software. After their scientific missions are complete, the satellites will be reconfigured to function as digipeater relays for Amateur Radio use, as part of the Automatic Packet Reporting System (APRS). ### ARRL STRENGTHENS THE CASE FOR MANDATORY **BPL NOTCHING**

The ARRL filed an ex parte submission with the FCC on November 30, providing additional support for its position that the FCC should require mandatory notching of the amateur bands by Broadband over Power Line (BPL). The ARRL's filing stated such devices can cause harmful interference to Amateur Radio operators, and requested that the FCC "establish rules that are appropriate for unlicensed BPL systems and which minimize the interference potential."

After the FCC released its Request for Further Comment and Further Notice of Proposed Rule Making in July 2009, the ARRL filed comments and reply comments and made oral and written ex parte filings, urging the adoption of Part 15 Rules which reflect both the capabilities and practices of the bulk of the BPL industry, and which are sufficient to protect licensed radio services in the  $\rm HF$  and  $\rm VHF$  bands.

"It has been painfully apparent that the present rules permit the deployment of BPL in configurations which cause severe, ongoing harmful interference if operated on radio spectrum that is in use locally," the ARRL asserted in its filing. The ARRL, in its numerous filings on this issue has "strenuously urged" the FCC to require full time, mandatory notching of all amateur allocations to at least 35 dB notch depths. "This level of notching is both achievable by present BPL systems and is typically, but not universally, implemented by the BPL industry." ### SOAR HIGH IN THE ARRL 10 METER CONTEST

The highest of the HF bands will be the central operating focus of many amateurs in the ARRL 10 Meter Contest, December 11-12. During the event, many propagation modes will be available: Sporadic-E will help you work stateside stations, a touch of meteor scatter in the morning will give you split-second chances to work stations -- you'd better be quick, though! -- and DX stations could find their way into the log, thanks to some recent signs of life from the F-layer. "Ten meters was open from the United States to Africa, Europe and South America during the CQ World Wide DX CW contest on the weekend of November 27," said ARRL Contest Branch Manager Sean Kutzko, KX9X. ### ON THE AIR: THE SPRATLY ISLANDS DXPEDITION GETS WINGS

The 37 operators from 15 countries who make up the DX0DX DXpedition Team that will go to the Spratly Islands is finalizing preparations for the almost month-long DXpedition that begins January 6, 2011. Instead of going by boat, the team will instead fly to Thitu Island where they will set up their operation. Thitu is the second largest island in the Spratly Islands. The Spratlys are a group of more than 750 reefs, islets, atolls, cays and islands in the South China Sea between Vietnam, the Philippines, China, Malaysia and Brunei. John W6JPP will bring them to the next regular General meeting (January).

Elections of Officers and Board Members was held. ### Board Meeting, Nov. 15, 2010

The SCCARA Board Meeting was called to order by Don AE6PM at 19:40.

Attendance: President: Don Steinbach AE6PM; Vice President: Fred Townsend AE6QL; Secretary: Viki Moldenhauer KI6WDS; Treasurer: Ned Tufekcic AC6YY; Trustee: Don Village K6PBQ; Directors: Lou Steirer WA6QYS, Wally Britten KA6YMD, John Parks W6JPP; Excused Absence: Directors John Glass NU6P, Gary Mitchell WB6YRU; Visitors: Gregg Lane KF6FNA, Clark Murphy KFKXO, Gwen Steirer KF6OTD.

Announcements: Don AE6PM announced the SCCARA-gram inputs are due to Gary no later than Monday November 29.

Treasurer's Report: checking = 4682.09; savings = 3847.03; cash = 126.89.

Secretary's Report: The October Board Meeting and November General Meeting Minutes were reviewed. John W6JPP moved to accept the minutes as amended; Lou WA6QYS seconded; motion passed unanimously.

Vice President's Report: Fred AE6QL said the January presentation on RTTY is tentative. Don AE6PM suggested a schedule, even if tentative, be placed in the SCCARA-GRAM.

Old Business: - Lou WA6QYS has made meeting room reservations for the Red Cross building for 2011; we are officially in the radio club room.

- John W6JPP will bring the SCCARA equipment for sale to the club meeting in January; he'll put into the SCCARA-GRAM that it will be available for purchase at the meeting that night, bring checks or cash.

- HF transceiver upgrade: John W6JPP reported that the committee (John W6JPP, Ned AC6YY, and Gary WB6YRU) reviewed products against the criteria of: durable enough for Field Day, easy visual operation, all filters built-in, HF and CW only. The recommendation is the ICOM 7200, at a package price of \$1395 by mail order. Discussion was held about existing club radios, a preference for buying locally to support HRO and get customer service. No decision was reached, pending evaluation of current equipment and a possible future donation.

- The 70cm repeater upgrade is up and running at Don AE6PM's; next is to build up the interface and get it mounted. The 440 repeater is working well, though there is a periodic delay on recycling on 2m.

- Discussion was held on the 2m repeater backup including issues with access, interference with the Central Valley and coverage of the Bay Area depending on location. A poll was taken of everyone's opinion. All seven members present were in favor of moving forward although Wally and Fred expressed reservations based on the above. Viki abstained. Lou moved to have John Glass NU6P look into 2m repeater cost and delivery status; Don K6PBQ seconded; motion was approved unanimously.

New Business: - Software for the Secretary is still under investigation.

- These are planning numbers only. Accurate projections of SCCARA-GRAM costs were not available. A 2-meter repeater backup and HF transceiver upgrades are being considered.

- Discussion was held about the meaning and impact of the state requiring vendors at the flea market to collect sales tax.

Station Trustee's Report: Don K6PBQ announced the station will be open this Saturday for the ARRL Sweepstakes.

Editor's Report: Gary reported by email that we're saving over ten percent now that the other clubs have been moved over to electronic delivery and suggested the board might want to consider having honorary memberships be electronic delivery.

N0ARY BBS Report: Gary reported by mail that the N0ARY BBS is running fine. The only thing new to report is that there are plans to switch the 6 meter antenna to vertical polarity and move it to a better location. This won't affect users, the 6 meter port is for longer distance forwarding. Some of the other BBSs have mounting issues with a 6 M horizontal antenna. Also vertical is not directional, which is better for nodes and centrally located BBSs.

Repeater Chairman's Report: Wally KA6YMD said things are working as well as can be expected.

Web Masters Report: Wally KA6YMD said it is working as well as can be expected.

Other miscellaneous announcements: John W6JPP expressed pleasure working with the board, as he steps down to let other members get involved at the board level. Fred AE6QL mentioned the FCC has formalized rules on vanity calls, and a path to replace a station trustee. Discussion was held about asking Bob Vallio to introduce officers at the December lunch meeting, and getting a group picture.

Future Actions: The Fixit List still consists of moving the axle, attaching the jack wheel, and fixing the aux tail light on the trailer; repairing coax cables, and adding antenna rotator connectors. Newly added was troubleshooting and repairing the FC-757AT antenna tuner at the Red Cross.


