A new wave of interest in the RRC Jackets has awoken.

At the December 10, 2021, RRC Monthly Meeting a sheet was circulated for members to sign-up for a RRC Jacket.

Since 2019 there has not been enough interest in the jackets, to meet the minimum order requirement of twelve.

Things have changed and at the December 10, 2021, meeting we had fourteen members say that they were interested in buying a RRC Jacket, with their call letters and the RRC patch embroidered on the left and right, on the front of the jacket.

With fourteen, and maybe a few more, in response to this article, ordering the jackets is now a GO.

Here are the manufacturer's details of the blue jackets, with yellow trim, that are now available in 2022:

Duraweav™ fabric has a smooth oxford nylon surface.

100% Polyester quilted lining.

Woven label.

15 mm (0.60 inch diameter) matte painted enamel snap front.

Set-in sleeves.

Front pockets.

Inside valuables pocket.

Rib-trim collar, cuffs, and bottom hem.

Water resistant.

The manufacture tells us that these jackets are true to size.

Price structure is as follows:

\$77 for the following sizes - S, M, L, and XL

\$79 for the following sizes - 2XL and XXL

\$81 for the following size - 3XL

RRC MEETING ON THE AIR (RRCMOTA)

Check into the RRC MEETING ON THE AIR on the Friday evenings that we do not have an in-person meeting. The net, on 146.910 MHz, starts at 8:00 p.m. with the latest AMATEUR RADIO NEWSLINE REPORT from the West Coast.

We then have an exchange of information that may be of interest to the members of the Reading Radio Club as well as those that are not RRC members.

The last part of the net is a roll call where we usually have 13 to 56 stations check-in and test their two-meter FM analog equipment. The roll call is last, so that late comers are not missed.

NOTE: The Continuous Tone Coded Squelch System, (CTCSS) frequency is 131.8 Hertz (3B). The CTCSS is often referred to as "PL" (Motorola's trade name).

The net has been in operation since Friday January 21, 1994, when we had thirteen check-ins during that first session, almost 28 years ago.
