




From the Fundraising Committee

RRC MEETING ON THE AIR (RRCMOTA)

Check into the RRC MEETING ON THE AIR on the Friday evenings that we do not have an in-person meeting. The net, on 146.910 MHz, starts at 8:00 p.m. with the latest AMATEUR RADIO NEWSLINE REPORT from the West Coast.

We then have an exchange of information that may be of interest to the members of the Reading Radio Club as well as those that are not RRC members.

The last part of the net is a roll call where we usually have 13 to 56 stations check-in and test their two-meter FM analog equipment. The roll call is last, so that late comers are not missed.

NOTE: The Continuous Tone Coded Squelch System, (CTCSS) frequency is 131.8 Hertz (3B). The CTCSS is often referred to as "PL" (Motorola's trade name).

The net has been in operation since Friday January 21, 1994, when we had 13 check-ins during that first session, over 27 years ago.

On Friday May 28, 2021, we had session number 1160. Jim Nicholas, W3ITH, was the Net Control.

The next RRCMOTA will be on Friday June 4, 2021, starting at 8:00 p.m., on the Reading Radio Club's 146.910 MHz, W3BN analog repeater. Dave Wiley, K3MXS, will be the Net Control.

Here Comes Field Day 2021

On the weekend of June 26 and 27, 2021, a great "Let's have fun" Amateur Radio annual event will take place. (Always the last FULL weekend in June).

This is the weekend of the American Radio Relay League (ARRL) annual operating exercise, an Amateur Radio event that has been taking place for the past 88 years.

This event covers all the bases. A contest – YES, a 24-hour emergency operating event – YES, A picnic – YES, A gathering of Ham Radio friends – YES, A test of equipment – YES, An antenna evaluation exercise – YES. An emergency drill – YES. A Scouting type camp out – YES. A RF Signal Tracking Exercise — YES. Excuse me, I think there are a few missing!

It is also an event that blends new and older experienced Hams for a weekend of learning.

Historically, the event has evolved around the idea of quickly setting up an Amateur Radio station at a location, other than at a permanent home station, and using emergency power for a 24-hour period during the last full weekend in June.

As stated by the League "The objective is to work as many stations as possible on the 160, 80, 40, 20, 15, and 10 Meter HF bands, as well as all bands 50 MHz and above, and in doing so to learn to operate in abnormal situations in less-than-optimal conditions. A premium is placed on developing skills to meet the challenges of emergency preparedness as well as to acquaint the public with the capabilities of Amateur Radio."

This can become quite an undertaking, loading up pickup trucks and transporting all the equipment that you might find at a home station, tower sections, beams, rotors, wire antennas, tables, chairs, etc. Recruiting members to share their motor homes, and do not forget the cooking gear and the supplies for several meals and snacks. It takes a committee and many club members to make the weekend a big success no matter what metric you use.

This year, as was the case in 2020, which was stimulated by the COVID-19 pandemic, the ARRL has changed the Field Day rules to promote participation by Radio Hams that may, for many reasons, not be able to take part at a remote Field Day location.

The rules have been changed to allow what are called "Home Stations" also known as Class D stations, to operate under the following guidelines:

"For Field Day 2021 only, Class D stations may work ALL other Field Day stations, including other Class D stations, for points" that can be added to a club's Field Day station score. In this case the Reading Radio Club W3BN Field Day score.

"Field Day rule 4.6 defines Class D stations as "Home stations," including stations operating from permanent or licensed station locations using commercial power. Class D stations ORDINARILY may only count contacts made with Class A, B, C, E, and F Field Day stations, but the temporary rule waiver for 2021 allows Class D stations to count contacts with other Class D stations for QSO credit".

"For 2021, Class D and Class E stations are LIMITED TO 150 Watts Peak Envelope Power (PEP) transmitter output."

The "Home Station" scores will be added to the W3BN portable score and included in the listing in QST. In 2020, six RRC members sent in their Class D scores to be added to the W3BN Field Day score.
