### **GIFT TO OUR CLUB**



### LOS ANGELES MARATHON


Radio operators are needed for the L.A. Marathon on **Sunday March 21, 2010**, to provide emergency communications.


There will be a new route this year. It will go from Dodger Stadium to the Santa Monica Pier, and will include Beverly Hills, Hollywood, and major studios.
