#### President's QRM

Our next monthly meeting will be on February 19th at the Northridge Hospital at the usual time and meeting place. The speaker will be Officer Royal Barber of the LAPD and Cliff Cheng, both of whom participated in the recent Northridge Hospital Emergency Exercise. Their talk will be about different ways of securing mobile amateur radio equipment so as to minimize the risk of theft.

Regarding emergency exercises, the next one scheduled at the Northridge Hospital will be on Thursday, October 21st. It will be another Drive thru Triage, but this time the simulated disaster will be an earthquake. At the time of the last emergency exercise, there were a total of 19 Northridge Emergency Responders. Fifteen signed-up for the drill and 13 actually were able to attend, which was just enough to meet our needs. At the next exercise on October 21st we will most likely need a greater number of people since it will be a region wide exercise and we will be contacting other participating hospitals Therefore, I am hereby governmental agencies. sending out an SOS asking more people to join the Northridge Emergency Responders. Just remember how good the Northridge Hospital has been to us: allowing us to use the 5th Floor Conference Room for our monthly meetings, Christmas Party, and testing sessions; for providing space for our amateur radio station; for providing space for monthly Board meetings and amateur radio classes; and for allowing us to use their parking structure for Field Day. One of the few ways that we can show our appreciation is by participating in a meaningful way in their emergency exercises and responding if an actual emergency were to occur.

Not to belabor the above, but at the critique following the Emergency Exercise, at least three different Hospital employees stated how helpful the "Hams" were. They

said that it would be very difficult for them to do both their hospital type duties and operate communications equipment. See the letter, on page four, that was sent to me thanking Club the for our participation in the Exercise.

# MARS Unifies Operation in Support of Haiti Relief Effort

To assist the MARS communications support effort in Haiti, the heads of the Army, Air Force, and Navy-Marine Corps MARS programs have agreed to divvy up responsibilities among the three Service MARS programs. According to Air Force MARS Public Information Officer David Trachtenberg, N4WWL/AFA3TR, this delegation of responsibility will facilitate more efficient utilization of MARS communications assets in the overall relief operation. On January 12, a 7.0 earthquake struck Haiti, killing thousands and wiped out the island nation's communication infrastructure.

Trachtenberg told the ARRL that Air Force MARS will have primary responsibility for coordinating and releasing public affairs information on the activities of MARS radio operators assisting with the Haiti relief operation. Navy-Marine Corps MARS will be responsible for recruiting volunteers -- who will travel to Florida at their own expense -- to serve in Haiti as part of the essential communications link. Army MARS will coordinate frequency authorizations and use of digital communications for MARS operations on the island, including the transmission of e-mail via radio links; this capability is especially useful in the absence of Internet connectivity.

"The delegation of responsibilities among the three MARS services not only makes practical sense, but is an excellent example of interoperability in action," said Air Force MARS Chief Allen Eiermann. "This represents true unity of effort," added Army MARS Chief. Navy-Marine Corps MARS Chief Bo Lindfors noted that the success of the MARS operation so far "demonstrates the value of this contingency communications capability in a real-world emergency."

According to Trachtenberg, volunteer MARS radio operators representing all three Service MARS programs have been on the ground in Haiti, working with military and medical teams to provide valuable communications support.
