
Club Picnic 2015

Born in 1927 in Amarillo, Texas, Archie Willis continued a childhood interest in radios into World War II and emerged as a Radio Officer in the US Merchant Marine. After voyages that touched each ocean and every continent, he returned to his high-school sweetheart, Rosemary, to raise a family.

Archie moved to California during the Fifties and began a long career in aerospace machinery working for glants like Northrup-Grumman and Lockeed-Martin before opening his own job shop in the Sixties. Surviving downturn and recession, he wound down his career as a model maker for Disney Enterprises.

Through all these years his interest in radio never diminished, staying active in all areas of amateur radio, serving as an officer in local and national societies and instructing license classes for aspiring operators.

Archie is survived by two of his sons, Tom and John, and his younger brother, Thomas.


