After-action Report for Field Day, June 27th and 28th 2015 Held at Granada Hills Charter High School San Fernando Valley Amateur Radio Club

First off, thank you to Club members and non-members who helped with the set-up and tear-down for Field Day. The following people, as always, can be counted on to further the interests of the Club. Our President, Don Pettric, Jr., (WG6H), Treasurer, Jack Eyster, (KO6V), Executive V P, Tom Peabody, ((K6TGP),our Secretary, Richard Donner, (WA6KYR), our unofficial Technical V P's Steve Wardlaw, (KN6Y) and Bill Stein, (KC6T).Kudos to the following folks who said yes to special events that we had this year. Johnny Spotts, (W6HTY) who operated a satellite station on Saturday and came back at 3 AM to try to pick up a pass on Sunday morning. Although he wasn't able to get in, he's a hero in my book. Lynn O'Connell, (KG6DNY) set up and operated a VHF station during the weekend. He was asked, and responded with a resounding YES; thanks Lynn. Another gentleman, Louis, (KG6WXX) took-one-for-the-team when a pulley broke loose from a push-up pole and struck him on the top of the head. He had a cut, but in true hard-core fashion, continued to help with the set-up and tear-down on Sunday. Again, thank you and if I've failed to mention someone, please know that your contributions are appreciated.

Before we get into crunching numbers, I want to say that although the turnout was sparse, there were people that made this year a "special event" in my mind. Ahmad Alromeadheen, (KK6BIG) was there for the entire 24 hour period. His enthusiasm was contagious. He worked with Johnny Spotts on satellite, drinking in all that he could glean from the experience. Gwendolyn, (K6GRH) came to operate SSB on 40 and he sat in with her, logging contacts and later working SSB. They both enjoyed the company and were full of smiles as they worked through the night. If for no other reason than to watch his enthusiasm, it was worth the work.

This year, we took a step in simplifying our set-up. The Club purchased two end-fed dipoles and erected the B&W folded dipole. All antennas worked satisfactorily and, like last year, 40 meters remained open all night long. 20 meters was active until approximately 1:30 AM Sunday morning. In spite of using wire, the Club faired well.

Ok, lets talk numbers. As in years past, we operated 3 Alpha. CW contacts totaled 188, Phone was 262. Total number of contacts equal 450. Total QSO points equaled 638 with a power multiplier of 2 for a claimed score equals 1,276; way up from last year. Please consider being part of next year's Field Day and helping the Club raise the score.

We owe a debt of thanks to Granada Hills Charter High School again this year, and in particular to Mike Panman who invited us back. Thank you for the use of the facility and the pop-ups, it makes the daytime operation much more bearable.
