Furloughs are usually busy times for missionaries and we are having our share of busyness... Our scheduled return (to Venzuela) date is August, 1975... Many of you knew of the need of $\$ 3,000$ for the Cassette Ministry. This is needed for cassettes and electronic equipment. We have been given a $\$ 3,000$ matching grant that is good until March 31, 1976. Now, for every dollar you give to this ministry, it will be matched with another dollar. We have over $1 / 3$ of the need already.

Our Cebu station is but one of six smaller stations FEBC has in different areas of the Philippines called our Provincial Network. Our Philippine director has asked Dave to delay our furlough for a year and take the position of Provincial Division manager for all of these stations. After much prayer and waiting upon God's will, we received the assurance that this is what the Lord would have us do. There will be much responsibility upon Dave in this position, so we will need your prayers that he might truly know God's guidance in each situation.

Groundbreaking for the two new Guam stations KTWG and KTWR was held June lst. There will be one medium (AM) transmitter and two short wave transmitters. The AM transmitter will reach the nearly 100,000 population on Guam and a similar number on surrounding islands. The short wave coverage will be directed to nearly half of the earth's population in China, Southeast Asia, Indonesia, Eastern Russia, and Australia. --Trans World Radio

WAMRAC (World Association of Methodist Radio Amateurs \& Clubs) has nets in England and South Africa for "World Wide Christian Friendship by Amateur Radio." They also have a certificate that is awarded to those who make contact with a certain number of individual members of WAMRAC. Perhaps we in ARMS might insititute such an award to encourage members (and others) to become more active on the air.

Sunday afternoon, Sept. 7, WøEXR Russ Young phone patched PY8ZAT John Harmon to a plane dedication service being held in Denver. The patch was plugged into the P.A. system so that all attending could hear the conversation. In this way some of the committee sponsoring the plane could talk with missionaries and the pilot who would be using the plane in Brazil. It was a good patch. Thank you, Russ.

## SIGNIFICANT BUSINESS MATTERS

The Mid-Atlantic Section and the New England Section have been combined into one Section called the Eastern Section.

There was a great deal of discussion of how to coordinate the Membership lists, the BEAM mailing list and the ARMS Directory. It was moved that the membership dues cover the period from June lst to the following May 3lst, in order that:

1. Membership covers the same period of time as our other fiscal year reports.
2. Members will be provided a specific and easily remembered date of expiration of membership and BEAM subscription.
