UPDATE - AUGUST 2007

From July 16 to August 2 Ray was in Leticia, Colombia. The trip went very well. On Saturday, July 28, there were 12 of us standing in an empty lot in Filedelfia, Brazil. This Ticuna village wants a recording studio on this site. They are producing 15-minute programs to air on a local radio station. There were several missions represented plus the local people. Of the 12 gathered there were 4 languages spoken: Spanish, Portuguese, English and Ticuna. Some of the group who were bilingual were translating for us. We had a common goal of helping these Ticuna proclaim Jesus Christ.

Helmut Menzel from Germany accompanied me to Leticia to help us design the two recording studios (one for the Ticuna and one for the Colombian radio station and Bible Institute). Helmut is an acoustics engineer with TransWorld Radio. His explanations and drawings were very helpful.

During the last few days and hours of our stay we were able to get full political backing for the proposed short wave radio station in Leticia. Pedro Martinez, a retired Colombian army sergeant, was extremely helpful in making these contacts. Pray for Pedro and his family. They are looking to the Lord for guidance as Pedro considers an offer to help in the administration of the State of Amazonas.I am trying to find a lap-top computer for him since we have a lot to coordinate by email. I am really encouraged by the contacts and interest I experienced this trip to Leticia.




