

JUST AN ADVANCE NOTICE TO ALL INTERESTED: The Annual ARMS Picnic will be held at the usual spot-Living Water Bible Conference grounds in the Poconos of Penna. on September 12,1964, the Lord willing. The ARMS editor learned of the activities of VE3BWY and asked him to tell us about the work the Lord has led him to do. So here is his reply: FROM VE3BWY: "I am a full gospel pastor of a church in Toronto and I have " as my call since 1947 when I came to Canada from England where I held the call G6WY from 1927. I was raised a Presbyterian, but I found the Lord in a much deeper way in 1939, receiving the Baptism in the Spirit and being healed in my body and delivered from the curse of tobacco. At that time I was in the Wireless Civilian Reserve of the Royal Air Force from which I received a commission as a Signals officer and saw active dutyas a Christian from 1939 to 1945. This was excellent training spiritually and I was able to prove that a person can truly live for Christ in the armed services. I am also a member of the Officer's Christian Union. It was during the war that I met many Christians of different denominations at the Christian Union camp meetings, and the Lord was teaching me the stupidity of man-made denominational barriers. I also had time to study much and made a most intensive study of the Word of God which has stood me in good stead since those days. Truly out of evil, God brings forth good. I was separated from wife, family, and ham radio, but not from the Lord or His Word which was truly a lamp unto my feet in those dark days of war. After the war, I trained and entered the ministry in 1947. I came to Canada to take over the responsibilities of a new testament church where it was the teaching that we were living in the days when God was restoring His church to its original form in the Acts of the Apostles. Thus we contended for both the nine fruits of the Spirit and the nine gifts of the Spirit, and we saw some wonderful things happen. In 1948, I experienced the first case of the ministry of casting out evil spirits when one was truly converted to Christ but had stubborn asthma. We prayed for him and were amazed to learn that his trouble was caused by spirits of infirmity and after these were cast out, he was permanently healed after 40 years of suffering. Two days later we were able to deliver a man contemplating suicide; this we also found by practical experience was an evil spirit, and the deliverance was quite spectacular. After these experiences our faith rose much higher, and since that time the Lord has used us to deliver many hundreds of people from spiritual and physical bondages, by praying in the name of Jesus against these satanic things. This led me to write books on the subject of exorism and the charismatic gifts of the Spirit, including the 'contraversial glossolalia' which is happening everywhere in the church at large today.
One major result of these books was that I began to receive many invitations to the mission field to preach and teach on these subjects to hungry mission-Missionary trips have been made to Brazil, Argentina, Mexico, and Columbia where the same results of deliverance took place everywhere and missionaries who cooperated were most encouraged. Many were healed of terrible diseases like cancer by the prayer of faith. In all these cases I have relied upon ham radio as a means to communicate back home to my wife; fortunately our church janitor holds the call VE3EWY and operates my station in my absence and keeps me in touch with the church at home. SSB has played a great part in excellent communication from Sao Paulo, Brazil, Mexican and Columbian cities. In a recent trip to Columbia, I met HK hams who showed me the greatest courtesy and actually presented a QSL card to HK4EB in Medellin two weeks after working him on 160 meters. He was quite surprised. In Columbia I ministered largely among the Presbyterians, for they are entering into a greater depth of spiritual renewal at this time. I also stayed with the Lutheran bishop in Bogota and his wife was healed and baptised in the Spirit while I was there. I had the privilege of meeting HR3JW , the Episcopal priest in Bogota who recently left Honduras. I was privileged to teach in the Inter-American Seminary in Medellin on the gifts of the Holy Spirit and teaching on exorcism was eagerly received by these Columbian Seminary students. While in Mexico and Columbia I met many of the Wycliffe Bible Translators who are doing a tremendouswork for God today. In the midst of avery busy life, Bob(VE3EWY) and myself have worked over 300 countries from Toronto, and our interests lie from 10 to 160 meters, CW, AM, SSB. We believe ham radio is a very fine mental therapy for those in the ministry who have such strong spiritual pressures on their lives today. WHYTE.
