3905.5 with 12 to 14 check-ins. We also continue to attend local hamfests around the state to promote ARMS. February 23rd was our first gathering at the National Guard Armory in Perry Iowa. The attendance was low due to ice and snow on the roads, but we had quite a number of hams come by the table to see what we were all about. We are getting the word out that we are here and the Fellowship nets are a great place to meet. One of the greatest inventions for a net control station is the SDR receivers located in different parts of the country. http://www.websdr.org/ will bring up all the receivers. You will have to pick the one that works best for your part of the country. http://websdr1.utahsdr.org:8901/ is the one I use for the 75 meter net, http:// websdr2.utahsdr.org/?tune=14250/ for the 20 meter net. When the band is long I hear all of the stations calling. The unfortunate problem with this, not all stations can copy net control. That is when we call on our DX station, Rich, WB0AKV, who assumes net control until the band becomes shorter and the local net control can resume. Rich has been a great asset to the Midwest Section. I encourage all net control stations to use the SDR receivers to enhance their readability of the net.

We are in the planning stage of this year's Midwest Section get-together. Suggestions are requested from Midwest members.

DMR has come to ARMS. Here in the Midwest we have several persons using the digital VOIP mode of DMR. If you are not familiar with DMR there are plenty of YouTube and Internet sources available to explain it. http://www.dmrfordummies.com/ is one such resource.

The decision was made to start our own Talk Group on the TGIF Network http://tgif.network/index.html). Talk group number 7399 was chosen for Amateur Radio Missionary Service to reflect how we sign with fellow ARMS members at the conclusion of a QSO.

TGIF Network is one of the main 3 networks available on DMR now. The 2 principal Networks are: DMR-MARC and Brandmeister. Any ham is welcome to use the 7399 Talk Group. In no way would/or does this replace our HF Nets but just another tool in Ham Radio Communication. If enough interest is shown there could be a World Wide Net held on 7399.

Instructions:

Refresh your browser so you are not going to the old chat room instead of this new one. Then go to our page and refresh your browser again and then click the chat room words in the header to get to the next page and then click on the ARMS image to get to the sign in. Here sign in as a guest using your name and call sign: Example= lew-N0CXY. You may also sign in using the username box generating a password so your sign in is protected but you need to remember that password to use that sign in again otherwise you will need a different sign in as a guest. I am not able to get or change passwords if you go that way and forget it. When done chatting you can logout or disconnect at the bottom of the sidebar on the left by clicking the circle with the line up from the center. Have fun!


FEBC currently broadcasts in 124 languages, of which 86 are to ethnic people groups around the world. We can be heard in 49 countries (52 are SW, while 70-72 are MW or FM). We broadcast 842 hours per day. The number of transmitters/stations utilized by FEBC are 265 (65 are proprietary, 200 are not).

The newest language we added is the Kim Mun, which can be heard in Southeast Asia.

In 2017, (most recent data) FEBC received 2.26 million listener responses through traditional means and 5.2 million responses online.

Countries where we've most recently added stations: Korea, Ukraine, Philippines, Mongolia, Mozambique, Indonesia and Kyrgyzstan.




Editors Report by James Fisher
