COAST GUARD REPORTS BOAT MISSING AT SEA

ARMS president, WA7MKH, Walt had some anxious moments over the Christmas holidays when the Coast Guard reported his children, Johnnie and Karen and her husband missing at sea while sailing around Baja California enroute to Guaymas, Mex. from San Diego.

Walt's daughter, and her husband, Ray live in Tuscon, and they felt it would be more convenient to store the boat in Guaymas, Mexico where they often visit a cousin, who is a missionary there. Walt knew the ship-to-shore frequencies they planned to use during the cruise to keep in touch with the Coast Guard. Nothing was heard from them, so a search began.

Several days later a Coast Guard PBY reported spotting them off the point of Baja near Santa Cruz. Their marine radio had broken down and they had been unable to communicate with the Coast Guard that they were safe. No telephone service out of Santa Cruz gave cause for further anxiety to Walt and his wife.

High winds prevented Ray and Karen and Johnnie from continuing the trip up the gulf to Guaymas, so they had to return to Santa Cruz and fly home.

By the time they arrived home, there were code records in the mail for them from Walt.

"Never again!" says Walt, after such a harrowing experience, does he want them to go to sea without adequate radio communications. Already they are working on getting a ham ticket, while Walt is providing them a transceiver which can be used both as a home station and to outfit the boat for a cruise.

A FIRST IN CHRISTIAN RADIO!

Thrilling news came from Trans World Radio of the first in a series of direct network religious broadcasts via satellite, January 23rd. The program was relayed simultaneously by satellite to the transmitting studios of Trans World Radio in Monaco and Bonaire. The program was later rebroadcast in other languages to TWR non-English listeners. Intelsat III is orbiting 22,300 miles out in space over the Atlantic.

W2RJQ, Leonard Van Saun, is presently serving with Trans World Radio in Chatham, N.J. Van was for seven years Beam editor and past president of ARMS. Another ARMS member is serving with TWR on Bonaire, Dave Newell, PJ9BG. Dave is the son of Earl, WA4ZIZ, director of Southeast ARMS. Bob Dickinson, W2CCE, assistantto-the-president of TWR, recently returned from inspecting the site for a new highpowered transmitter to be located in Swaziland Africa.
