


God Is Always Moving To Accomplish His Promises

There's been much excitement the last few months about a new aircraft that has joined the JAARS fleet. The turboprop Kodiak is able to carry more cargo with the added benefit that it runs on the much cheaper and easier to get jet fuel. As much as we



enjoyed seeing this plane in the sky over the JAARS Center, we knew it needed to travel to where it could help speed Bible translation. That day arrived on September 19th, as we watched the Kodiak, outfitted with a large internal fuel tank, lift into the sky-controlled by the experienced hands of ferry pilot, Steve Ottaviano.

The 10,000 mile flight was made up of three 12+ hour flight days. The final destination was the SIL linguistic center, Ukarumpa, Papua New Guinea where its arrival was eagerly anticipated.

The reception given to the pilots was most joyful. Many dropped what they were doing to be at the hangar to see the landing of this gift from God. With the arrival of the

ters. It's a wonderful opportunity to clearly show what we do and how we do it. The comments we receive from our guests are always positive and encouraging.

In Guinea-Bissau, my department installed solar power, satellite internet, computer network, and delivered parts to upgrade a water well. All in a remote area where Bible translation is going on for seven people groups. God answered prayer and the team returned rejoicing over what God had accomplished. Jungle Jump Off, a one-week program, gave us opportunity to host groups of young people who come to the JAARS Center for a taste of missionary life. These high school-aged young people are pursuing an interest in missions. We host groups at our home, feed them, and tell stories of our life in the Philippines. What a joy to pass the torch for missions to the younger generation.

The highlight of this year was in July when we returned to the Philippines for three weeks to run a music workshop. We had prayed and you had prayed that the participants would be diverse among the Koronadal Blaan believers. God answered and gave us eleven attendees from four different church groups. Ten of them were pastors, and one of the pastors was a woman.

We know God sent them, by their great excitement to use their own ethnic music for building strong worship within the Blaan church. We were amazed at the God-given talent that emerged. They created lyrics with deep feeling and then created beautiful tunes to match. The end result was a 12 song CD. More recently we had 50 cassette tapes made and sent to Pastor Cuma for distribution. To celebrate when our founder, Cameron Townsend took the first group of Bible translators into Mexico on November 11th 1933, WBT takes a day for prayer—called the Wycliffe Day of Prayer. Activities and prayer times focus on where God has led us and the future of Bible translation. One of the activities we have at JAARS is the display of Scriptures that have


long distance to see our work and have a chance been published in the previous year. One by one, they are named and placed on display. This year,
