For to us a child is born, to us a son is given, and the government will be on his shoulders. And he will be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace. <*Isaiah 9:6.* Therefore the Lord himself will give you a sign: The virgin will be with child and will give birth to a son, and will call him Immanuel. <*Isaiah 7:14.*



Christian Worldview—Tool For Blaans

In November the Koronadal Blaan mother tongue translators met again for a seminar that will help them think through how Scripture relates to day-today life as they translate God's Word.

To introduce this concept successfully, it is helpful to understand how people adapt to change and what makes them resist change.

One of these concepts was how to define a Christian Worldview. They had some examples we'll share here.

Using the Creation, Fall, Redemption, and Restoration perspective, participants made a simple exercise on worldview analysis. When we look at anything (tangible or intangible) in this world, we know three things about it.

- 1. It is part of God's good creation.
- 2. Yet it is fallen and affected by sin—distorted somehow, broken, falling short of its original purpose.
- 3. But it is being, and can be, redeemed.

The plan of God is to wipe all creation clean of the effects of sin until it is restored to wholeness, beauty and glory: (reconciled by the Blood of Christ).

This is the basis of Christian Worldview, and without these three perspectives, people have a distorted view of reality.

More points were: Language in the Plan of God, Culture in the Plan of God, and The Dynamics of Change.

The Blaans learned about identifying common barriers to Scripture Engagement and then discussed theological foundations.
