Meeting called to order at 7:35 p.m. by President, Brian Adee (K2DLB)

Secretary Report:

January 19, 2011 – Since the minutes of the meetings are now published. The reading of the minutes will not be read; unless there is a request for them to be read Brian asked if saw any corrections or deletions for the business meeting minutes of 01.19.2011 in the BARA Newsletter. Ann (KB3UQC) was concerned about having an article written by other people for a different publication and used for our newsletter. She just wanted to make it clear that we need to obtain permission from the writer before printing the article in our newsletter, or we could cite the website and direct people to that article instead. Motion was made by Ford (AB2HS) to accept the secretary's minutes of the 01.19.2011 business meeting as printed and

seconded by Tom (N2BGM). It was voted on and passed.

Treasures Report:

Treasures Report was read and explained. Motion to accept the treasurer's report as presented, made by Ford (AB2HS) and seconded by George (N2GSS), it was voted on and passed.

Committee Reports:

Radio Shack- John (WB2FQZ) reported that he traveled up to the BARA radio shack last Sunday and noticed a piece of roof shingle laying on the ground. He did not notice where it came off but wanted to let everyone know about it. The road was icy in the wheel ruts and some repair to the driveway will need to be done in the spring. Nevertheless, everything looked fine.

Fundraising- John (WB2FQZ) reported that he had been in touch with Doug's Fish Fry To-Go and spoke with the people there a second time and confirmed everything what he had spoken about at the board meeting a couple of weeks ago. He gave a quick rundown with their requirements are and how the payout works. However, their calendar has grown a few months longer since he last spoke with them and are booked until late into 2012. At this point, we will think about it some more. The profit potential was low and risky.

Ham Fest- Brian (K2DLB) showed the 2011 Ham Fest ticket that he printed from a website, so there would be no cost for them this year. New Business:

Vinnie (N1JPM) spoke about John Carrington had lined up events last year, and we should ask if he would be interested in doing it this year. It was suggested that the board look into it and get back to the membership. That we should look into finding some kind of 2 meter antenna set up, so if nothing else, someone can plug in with at least a mobile unit. Brian (K2DLB) had some ideas but would bring it up at the board meeting and then to the membership.

Picnic Pavilion- Jack (W2GHH) brought up that he has booked the pavilion at the Otsiningo

Park for the Picnic, August 17, 2011, and that it only cost \$20.00 for the day. On February 16, the State of New York will issue 2 points on your driving license plus a fine, if you're caught using your cell phone while driving. As far as anyone knows, nothing has changed that about talking through your Amateur Radio but the consensus is to set down your mike and stop transmitting while driving by a police officer. He may think you are talking on a device or cell phone and attempt to stop you, or you could possibly cause interference on their radio and promote them to look into the situation.

Interesting Point- Brian (K2DLB) brought up an interesting bit about LED Christmas Lights. In a publication, he received that there are some strings of Christmas lights on the market that

can be hazardous if they were stepped on or broken. They are known to contain high levels of lead, arsenic and a dozen other potentially hazardous substances. Being the red ones the worst of all colors that contain up to eight times more lead then what California law allows. This came from a notice that he received in from his business that he is in.
