Emergency Service building at 7:00 pm.
President Brian Adee (K2DLB) called the meeting together at 7:05 and asked if anyone had any corrections or comments of the Secretary's report as published in the BARA Fact. Not hearing any Paul Slocum (N2NCB) made the motion to accept the January 4, 2011 Secretary's report as printed. Brian (K2DLB) seconded the motion. It was voted on and passed.

Paul (N2NCB) then gave the Treasurer's report and explained the different items in his report. Vinnie Griggs (N1JPM) made a motion to accept the Treasurer's report as presented. John Carrington (WB2SGS) seconded the motion. It was voted on and passed.

Brian (K2DLB) asked if anyone had been up to the W2OW shack, and no one had. Brian (K2DLB) said that we could go onto the HAMfest business. He started off by telling the group that he had checked with a local vendor about producing signs for the HAMfest. The dimensions for these signs are 2 foot high by 3 foot wide all weather cardboard signs. These are the same type of signs that we see political or sometime real estate signs on lawns with the wire supports to stick into the ground. After some discussions of how many were needed/ could afford it was voted on to purchase (5) at \$20.00 a piece for a total of \$100.00. There was some discussion about making them out of plywood, but the next problem would be trying to paint them and letter them during the winter months.

Ford Drake (AB2HS) talked about what other HAMfest committees are paying for putting on their HAMfest compared to ours. He also spoke of an incident that developed from the Elmira's HAMfest this year and how would we handle it, if someone who is not a licensed HAM operator wins a radio from our door prize. It was agreed upon that we need to make up a sign that can be displayed where the door prize tickets are collected, stating only licensed amateur radio operators can receive the door prizes. He also talked about the layout at this time for the vendors and tailgaters. He also informed the board that there was a wedding reception going on the Saturday before the HAMfest until 7pm so setting up will have to take up for the HAMfest. place later in the evening. He also talked about how we could lay out parking in the front with some designated for handicap parking with the majority for unloading and loading available during the event. He told what vendors were contacted and he is still waiting to hear back from a couple of others. Ford (AB2HS) asked Brian (K2DLB) if he thought he could man the radios during the HAMfest and guide people to the event. He said he probably could. There were a few other questions that were brought up by others but mainly everything was going well.

Vinnie (N1JPM) spoke about the menu items that

the Knight of Columbus had informed him that they were planning to serve at the HAMfest. He had some concerns that they were going to serve only soup and hot dogs for lunch and asked if they would consider doing Hamburg's as well. They said that they were concerned about having a lot of left-over hamburgers because they were not sure if they could use them for some other event. So Vinnie (N1JPM) made a motion that the club buys any left-over hamburgers the Knights of Columbus were not able to sell, and the motion was seconded by Paul (N2NCB). Vinnie (N1JPM) said we could use them for field day or work party at the shack. If not we can even sell them to the membership at the next meeting, that way there would be more than just hot dogs available during the HAMfest. He also handed Ford (AB2HS) an envelope containing 250 tickets that he made up for the HAMfest.

Paul (N2NCB) said that he would contact our insurance company, so we can get a copy of our insurance and will forward a copy of our rider to include the Knights of Columbus on it.

Brian waved the reading of the last general meeting minutes since the secretary was not in attendance.


Paul N2NCB read the treasure report. Motion made to approve as read and this motion was seconded and passed

answered me on the radio. Somewhere up there is the sun, shooting out blobs of light across space and generating raw radio waves in the process. But now

Ol' Sol is having a fit, a flare affair with flair, a mighty coronal mass ejection. The sun is burning up, and taking my QSOs with it.

Times like this, propagation becomes unpredictable so maybe I can be ready for one of those moments when the ionosphere becomes like a mirror in the sky. I head back to the shack and swing the beam around to the east. Nothing. No beacons, no WWV

(you'd think they'd run a special show for us, a rocking tick-tock or just some time sometime). The high point on the sunspot cycle becomes the low point of my day, and the day is just beginning.

I'll wait out the blackout in the shack. I'd like to file a complaint with someone, but I don't think there's anyone keeping an eye on the ions.






