

The formal club business will be conducted AFTER Jay's presentation.



Some of you may have heard the 10 meter testing done from the repeater site over the last few weeks. Bob (WA2VCS) has loaned his 10 meter rig for a few months to allow us to gain some experience using a remote base. The intent of the 10 meter operation is to investigate more about repeater capabilities as well as expose some to other portions of the radio hobby. If there were more consistent 10 meter openings it would be more exciting; however, possibly we will have some good opportunities. It may be up and running by the time you read this article; however if not, stay tuned to the announcement. It will provide information as to when it will be operational and how it can be accessed. We have not yet decided how long to leave this capability on the air. All amateurs are encouraged to try it and, of course, be sensitive to other possible users of the repeater.

The BARA Board of Directors has been a big help to me since I have been in this position as committee chairman. In discussions with the Board over the last few months they have provided background as to how the club obtained the equipment, history about past operation and guidance for the future.

In the last Board meeting I reviewed the current status of the repeater operation and some alternatives for changing the way it services BARA and the amateur community. It was a very good meeting with lots of discussion and a variety of views presented. The discussion will continue in next month's Board meeting and I would expect a proposal to be presented to the general membership in a couple of months. Will keep you updated as we progress. HAMFEST UPDATE

You all should have received a mailing from the hamfest committee. Again in 1995, the committee is seeking your financial and physical support!

The cutoff for a go / no-go decision on the hamfest is the April 1995 general meeting. The committee has gotten off to a great start, but they need your support to pull of a top quality hamfest.

The SHAREs approach was outlined in the mailing - without sufficient funding to support the hamfest, it simply cannot be held. Contact Paul N2NCB to arrange for your SHARE purchase.

We'll have an update on the hamfest at the April general meeting.

VANITY CALL UPDATE

The Federal Communications Commission form necessary for applying for an Amateur Radio vanity call sign-Form 610-V--will not be available until after May 1.

Amateurs who call the FCC to request the form before then will not have their names recorded and it will be necessary for them to request the form again, when it is available.

Applications for amateur vanity call signs will not be accepted until after the forms are available, i.e., until sometime after May 1. The FCC will make a public announcement of the date of opening of the first "gate" for vanity call sign applications.

Beginning May 1, 1995, FCC Form 610-V may be requested by calling the FCC Forms Distribution Center at 800-418-3636. Or, send an SASE anytime to ARRL-VEC, for a form 610-V by return mail as soon as they are available after May 1. Write "Form 610-V request" on the outer envelope.

A NEW FCC SERVICE

The FCC has instituted a toll-free phone line at its Gettysburg, Pennsylvania licensing division for customer service inquiries. Amateurs may call 800-322-1117 weekdays between 8 AM and 4:30 PM Eastern Time to access an automated information system with recorded messages on interference complaints, form requests, records, and Amateur Radio call sign assignments.

Other messages regard fee information and processing times. A touch-tone telephone is required.

The FCC said the new service was part of its response to a presidential order that the federal government be "customer driven." The FCC said it used a series of focus groups with external customers to identify the desire for an 800 number at its licensing division.

"Within the next 18 months," the FCC said, "customer service standards will be developed for other areas of Commission operations to ensure that FCC customers receive the highest quality of service possible. As these new standards become available, the FCC will inform its customers."

LOOK AT THAT LICENSE

Amateurs receiving new or modified FCC licenses after June 8, 1994, should carefully note their expiration date. Only new, first licenses or specific renewals have a full 10-year term.

Amateur license upgrades, changes of address, call sign, or name, are processed with the original expiration date intact. That is, they are not automatically extended for 10 years.

The FCC, using new computer software recently installed, is processing amateur licenses in this manner to conform with to the way in which it processes all other Private Radio Service licenses.

The FCC currently recommends that amateurs submit license renewal applications 60 to 90 days before their expiration date. The Commission said it intends eventually to mail license expiration notices to amateurs, In the meantime, the ARRL is sending license expiration notices to ARRL members, along with an FCC Form 610 and a return envelope to the FCC's licensing division in Gettysburg, Pennsylvania.
