Book Review — Spycraft

Speculation about "Numbers Stations" has a long history in the Ham and SWL communities. For years it has been "common knowledge" that these stations were part of a secret communications network. Well, this rumor has been confirmed. *Spycraft, the secret history of the CIA's spytechs, from Communism to Al-Qaeda,* by Robert Wallace and H. Keith Melton, is a history of the CIA Office of Technical Services (OTS) and related departments. It details how "Numbers Stations" played a role in Agent Communications Networks and it offers a wealth of other information.

Spycraft (ISBN 978-0-452-29547-6) is published by Plume (an imprint of Penguin) and is available from many retailers. The cover price is \$18.00.
