Vice President's Report—February 2009

As I write this, the intrepid KP5 team is going through last minute things such as unexploded ordinance training and should be on the air from Desecheo in a few more days. As usual, everything has not gone exactly as planned, but as K4UEE always says, you assess the situation and make changes to the plan. I am sure Bob will be totally up to holding equipment above his head while he wades to shore. I expect this is going to be a very interesting DXPedition to listen to because of the pent up demand here and especially in Europe. The sky may well light up, and there have been a few offthe-wall suggestions that in times of low sunspot activity, the excitation of the ionosphere by huge numbers of high power signals improves propagation.

Speaking of sunspots, the last "official" one was 22 days ago. We are headed towards the previous spotless record of 30 days for recent months. Nevertheless, there is nice DX out there. A number of us have managed to knock off several new ones on 160m since the beginning of the year, and I believe K4DLI has picked up around 7 new ones on 160m. Have you noticed that even without spots the flux has crept up? Maybe Sol is awakening.

The DXPros have made several trips to Mike Almeter's house, the latest on being last Saturday. The Kentucky Rifleman landed a perfect shot to anchor Mike's 80m inverted Vee. Mike is picking up a lot of the practical

things not necessarily covered in the textbooks. Mike is closing in on 200 countries worked on a wire—way to go, Mike!

Our speaker this month will be Tim Lemmon, WK4U, on the use of Linux in ham radio applications. Although I had played with Linux around 10 years ago, Tim convinced me to give it another try-and times have really changed. I had a Linux machine running in the shack from around October till a few days ago, when I updated it to the new version—which you can take away on disk from the meeting. I never once had to reboot the machine. This was on a very old Dell 8200 which labored mightily under Windows XP but is gazelle swift running Ubuntu Linux. I have also set an obsolete machine up on my second floor so I can make a judgment as to whether to go down for 160 greyline at sunrise. Try it, you'll like it—and it's not just for geeks anymore. Tim has also supplied a free pdf file from the Ubuntu team to cover things you may have questions about. Chaz has placed it on the SEDXC website under "links." Check it out.

DX PACKET FREQ. (Corrections, 1/2/04)
N4XMX off line(2400) 144.91 (direct, Vinings),
off line(2400) 145.65 (direct or ATLDX)

Note: ATLDX is down right now, direct OK.

KS4Q (2400) 144.97 MHz; 'c saw3' (2400) 145.63 MHz; 'c saw4' (1200) 145.69 MHz; 'c saw5'

Once you get a connect on any of the three above frequencies, enter 'c saw1'. Once you get a connect to saw1, enter 'c ks4q' or simply 'dx'. or telnet dx.ks4q.net NI4X (9600) 144.93, 145.71, 440.75 K4UGA (Athens)(2400) 145.67 (SE MegacIst) (telnet 128.192.52.40 599, must put in port 599)
