From the Vice President:

My how time flies. My woods are already choked with vegetation, the copperheads are out, and the trees are in full leaf. Even the copperhead-killing cat can't keep up with

them. I was rushing our a few nights ago to disconnect before unexpected lightning and a 3-4 foot long copper head rushed by only a foot ahead. He looked awfully nasty. It seems that I am just a little late with my plans to put up just one more wire antenna. Jim Streible has convinced me to put up a long doublet, feed it with ladder line and use a beefy truly balanced tuner. We are going to use such a beast optimized by K4DLI for the NFARL Field Day CW antenna.

Jim's balanced tuner suggestion makes me realize how close we are to DAYTON. Such a tuner is one of the items I will be thinking about as I comb the aisles. Actually, I was pretty impressed with the construction of the MFJ 1500W balanced tuner when I peeked inside one at Dayton last year. I'll have to take a closer look.

The times they are a changing. Have you noticed the explosion in decent to outstanding direct conversion receivers lately? I just saw Sherwood's comment that in many respects the Perseus is the best receiver he has ever analyzed. I notice HRO has a new direct conversion receiver from Italy in their catalog. The specs look pretty close to the Perseus and the price looks a lot lower. Maybe these things are about to usher in a new architecture. I don't know if they are ready to displace the older tried and true architectures yet, but I suspect we will see at least one new high-end transceiver at Dayton this year using direct conversion. The rumor is that at least one well-loved Japanese company sees this architecture in their future.

I was very active on RTTY back in NJ only a few years ago, and reasonably active on digital modes. When I graduated to a HAL DXP38 TNC, I was convinced I had found the ultimate for RTTY. And then the sound cardbased programs started to nibble away at the HAL's edge, finally taking the lead in my mind around five years ago. And then I moved to Marietta.

My setup here started in the early stages of disorganization, and the entropy has increased every day since. I have one of those basements where I might become trapped and starve to death entangled in cables while my wife is away at a bridge tournament. But finally, a number of months back at an NFARL meeting, I got a look at Ham Radio Deluxe and its digital adjunct, DM780. What a beautiful looking program. And what a digital setup. It has more modes on it than I can count, and to me the SuperBrowser seems the RTTY equivalent of CW Skimmer. Between that and comments from Neil Foster, the digital pulses started to nibble at me once more. I am finally hooked up digitally again—and took the lazy way out by using a RigBlaster instead of rolling my own interface. Heck, my parrot has started to sin in RTTY again and has added bpsk to his repertoire.

And once again, I find time has moved on. The digital programs available today significantly outperform my old standards from four years back—and I am running several simultaneously in rx just to look at the error differences between programs.

At our program this month Neil Foster, and hopefully his guest Bill Ripley if Bill's schedule works out will intrigue you with the world of digital DX.—you might be surprised to see JT's, and some mighty unusual DX running PSK and putting in good signals here. I think you will be stunned by the beauty of the HRD program and pleased with its capability. And "free" is especially good. I had been a little reluctant to install Ham Radio Deluxe because it seemed complex, but Neil was able to make it seem simple with a little advice here and there and a phone call or two. He'll do the same for you at the May meeting.

Yes, just as with the wire antenna and the digital hookup, I'm running a little late and have not sent the May program information to Chaz yet. But the old antenna professor, K4DLI, will be revealing his time tested secrets on matching all sorts of antennas, showing you how simple it is these days with a meter such as the AIM unit and several really slick programs such as TLW. Jim's networks have been used in many places, including at the base of several antennas out in my yard. You'll be amazed at how easy it is to design and build them.

Our program in July will be a great one.
Greg Abernathy, Al4UD, who is a

DX PACKET FREQ. (Corrections, 1/2/04) N4XMX off line(2400) 144.91 (direct, Vinings),

off line(2400) 145.65 (direct or ATLDX)

Note: ATLDX is down right now, direct OK. KS4Q (2400) 144.97 MHz; 'c saw3' (2400) 145.63 MHz; 'c saw4'

(1200) 145.69 MHz; 'c saw5'

Once you get a connect on any of the three above frequencies, enter 'c saw1'. Once you get a connect to saw1, enter 'c ks4q' or simply 'dx'. or telnet dx.ks4q.net NI4X (9600) 144.93, 145.71, 440.75 K4UGA (Athens)(2400) 145.67 (SE MegacIst) (telnet 128.192.52.40 599, must put in port 599)
