We Need to Take Action

- If you experience interference, file a public complaint online with the FCC and obtain a ticket number https://consumercomplaints.fcc.gov/hc/en-us
- ► The FCC has also asked that we call the "Stop Buzzer" number(s) documented in their license application narrative
 - ▶ Report the interference and request they cease testing
- We know that previous calls to the published numbers went to voice mail
- ► The Chaos attorneys recently asked the FCC to revise their license(s) to add a new "Stop Buzzer" number.
 - ▶ That number is, "Jason Chlipala at 610-349-0104".
 - If they don't answer or don't cease, notify Skip
- Promulgate this information as much as you can
- We need to record the dates and times of each incident, ticket numbers and whether the interference stopped when the "Stop Buzzer" number was called
