
3M today issued an immediate stop use alert on its 3M™ DBI-SALA® Nano-Lok™ Self Retracting Lifeline with Anchor Hook. The notice urged users to remove the product from service until inspection is performed.

The company issued the following statement:

"As part of 3M Fall Protection's ongoing commitment to delivering high quality safety equipment, we are notifying our customers of the following information related to specific versions of the 3M™ DBI-SALA® Nano-Lok™ Self Retracting Lifeline with Anchor Hook. 3M Fall Protection has identified a very low potential for the DBI-SALA® Nano-Lok™ Self Retracting Lifeline with Anchor Hook to be assembled with an unformed top swivel eye rivet. An improperly formed rivet may become displaced from the top swivel eye. An unformed rivet may result in the SRL becoming detached from the anchor hook, which could result in severe injury or death. Due to this, we are sending out an inspection notice so this issue can be detected by inspecting the self retracting lifeline as shown below. A copy of this notice can be found here."

Tidbits from the ARRL Contest Update

October 27,2021

Submit your log, no matter how big or small!

All contest participants, whether they are serious contesters or just casual operators, should submit their log to the contest sponsor. Submitting logs assists the contest sponsor with the scoring of the contest, as QSOs are cross-checked against the logs of stations that are worked. Additionally, contest sponsors allocate resources to contests based upon the total number of logs submitted, assisting them in gauging how much activity there is in each event.

If you do make a few casual contacts in a contest, and do not submit a log, the stations you worked will not be penalized. For example, if you made a few contacts in the contest to "hand out points" to other contesters, your QSOs with them would be considered as "unique." Uniques are call signs that appear in only a few logs that were submitted by the stations that worked you.

Lastly, you might be surprised at how well you might do in a contest, even if your QSO count is low. For example, I submitted a contest log that contained only 5 QSOs, which ended up not only being a division winner, but also scored in the top ten in W/VE in the category that I entered!

Keep those logs coming in!

WSJT-X Version 2.5.1 has been Released

From ARRL News

10/26/2021

The WSJT-X development team has announced the general availability release of WSJT-X version 2.5.1. This release mainly contains improvements and repairs defects related to Q65 and JT65 when used with nonstandard and compound call signs. Those planning to use Q65 or JT65 to make weak-signal contacts involving a nonstandard call sign should upgrade to this version. Also included is a new feature for microwave aircraft scatter, as well as repairs for bugs detected since the general availability release of version 2.5.0.

A complete listing of changes is available in the <u>Release Notes</u>. Links to WSJT-X 2.5.1 <u>installation packages</u> for Windows, Linux, and Mac are available.


