
JANUARY 4TH MEETING!!!

This is the same place we stayed last year. The procedure is exactly the same as last year. There are a lot of restaurants close by. The hotel website is: <u>https://www.ihg.com/holidayinnexpress/hotels/us/en/dayton/dayml/hoteldetail</u>.

Here's the deal: I have completed a "group sales agreement" with the facility. It is **UP TO YOU** to call and confirm a room with the hotel. A Year-Long Operating Event Recognizing Volunteers



As announced in the January 2023 issue of QST (<u>announcement link</u>), ARRL is celebrating a year-long operating event honoring all ARRL volunteers: Volunteers On the Air.

In similar fashion to the 2014 ARRL Centennial Celebration, and the 2018 International Grid Chase, this event will be exclusively driven only by QSOs uploaded to Logbook of The World (LoTW).

Highlights of the event include:

- Earning Points for contacting W1AW Portable Stations: There will be week-long activations of portable W1AW/# stations in all 50 states, and in several US Possessions/Territories, that will generate on-air activity to earn points. Each state will be activated twice. The schedule of when which states will be activated as posted in the dashboard above will be updated as changes/additions occur. See the <u>POINTS TABLE</u> for the full list of points.
- **Contacting ARRL Volunteers or Members on the air**: ARRL Officers, Directors, Section Managers (and their appointees), Staff, and even Members domestically (and DX) can be contacted for points. See the <u>POINTS TABLE</u> for the full list of points.

Using Logbook of the World (LoTW – see <u>http://www.arrl.org/logbook-of-the-world</u>) as the QSOs data source, the 2023 Volunteers On The Air event features W1AW activations from all 50 states (twice) and several territories during 2023. Weeks will begin on a Wednesday and end on a Tuesday. Some weeks will be shown as off weeks to avoid other major operating events.

Participants will work W1AW portable stations and ARRL volunteers (see links in dashboard at top of this page) to earn QSO points.

Participants do not need to upload to, or participate in LoTW. Uploads to LoTW by W1AW portable stations and by the volunteers will feed the points scoring system. [Participants are not required to be ARRL Members. Even so, we encourage all Amateur Radio operators who are not members to consider joining the comradery with our 160,000+ current members. When joining, you'll discover support, inspiration, and advice to elevate your Amateur Radio experience.]

A Leaderboard will be activated after the event ramps up, and Certificates will be available during and after the event concludes. Once the year is completed, a final summary will be released.

Revisit this page regularly for updates!

This is a great opportunity to pursue a Worked All States in a year (or less) on the modes available. Since the participating stations WILL be using LoTW, you can be assured of a timely confirmation of your valid contacts. If it is anything like the 2014 centennial event, there will be lots of activity on many bands (including WARC) and 10 meters is likely to be open too! Plan your fun! 73, John / N8FYL

Winter Field Day (WFD) 2023

Originated in 2022 by Gregg / N8GEO massaged for 2023 by John / N8FYL

It's that time again for "Winter Field Day". We as a club have been participating in this event for the past few years and we have had a blast. All years (except 2021) we have been at the Tucker Senior Center (where our monthly meetings are). This year we will be back at the senior center again on January 28, 2023.



For those of you that aren't familiar with this event, it is a great time for learning how to operate in a simulated emergency without Edison generated power. It's also a fun way to learn operating skills, how to set-up a station, and how to put up an antenna. You don't need to feel intimidated at all, we all have been in your spot. But here is an easy way to learn a little or learn a lot or even operate if you want. It is all up to you. You could even bring some equipment, or your favorite latest antenna project. It's all fair game. So think about attending. We have a 24 hour window to operate and we also set-up starting around 8 or-9 AM Saturday morning. Come early and stay late. If you are interested in operating we will have plenty of operating windows available to get you on the air.

You may have learned earlier this year, WFD organization is now handled by a new group of hams. They have revamped the <u>WFD website</u>, and there are some minor rules adjustments for 2023. The rules are found on <u>this page</u>.

New for 2023 is

- an additional 4th category: M for Mobile / Mobile stationary stations.
- an additional Antenna bonus: you may claim 500 points if you are setting up one or more antennas just for WFD.

Here are some excerpts from the "Winter Field Day" website (https://www.winterfieldday.com/) rules.

At the Winter Field Day Association, our mission is to encourage emergency operating preparedness during the winter months when the potential for freezing temperatures, snow, ice, and other hazards may present unique operational challenges.

At the WFDA, we use the term contest very loosely around here, so don't get too hung up on our rules. At the end of the day, your total points don't matter. What you learn during WFD and your ability to adapt and overcome sudden obstacles is what will help you during unexpected emergencies. As we continue with another year of the WFD exercise, we want to encourage participants not to chase the contacts or the points but to test their abilities and equipment. If you want to exchange signal reports, please give each other accurate information, so the other station knows how well their station is working.

Operational Period: Winter Field Day is always held the last full weekend in January. For 2023, it will be held on January 28th and 29th. The 24-hour operational period starts at 1900 UTC on Saturday, the 28th and ends at 18:59 UTC on Sunday, the 29th. Stations may begin setting up no earlier than 19:00 UTC on Friday before. However cumulative set-up time shall not exceed 12 hours.

Bands: All Amateur bands except 12, 17, 30, and 60 meters. To qualify as a band worked, at

least 1 valid, two-way QSO must have taken place on the said band during the contest.

Modes: CW, Phone (includes SSB, AM, FM, DMR, C4FM, etc. If the end result is voice, it's Phone), and Digital (includes PSK, RTTY, Olivia, Packet, SSTV, ATV, JS8Call and other soundcard modes. If the end result is text or a picture, it's digital). (note FT8 & FT4 cannot send the WFD exchange)

Suggested Frequencies: (to make it easier to find each other)

HF CW – 1810-1820, 3.530-3.550, 7.030-7.050, 14.035-14.055, 21.030-21.050, 28.030-28.040 HF SSB – lowest 30 kHz of the US General Class Phone bands (160m-15m), 28.400-28.425MHz (10m)

6m/VHF/UHF – adjacent to, but not on, nationally recognized simplex calling channels.

Start thinking about coming out to the event. Also, write down your Winter Field Day questions because we will be discussing this event at the January meeting. All questions are welcome.

Make some plans to participate, either with the club, or at home. In the unlikely event of a conflict with a Lions playoff game ... well we can dream can't we?

N3FJP Winter Field Day Software Upgrade Required!

Winter Field Day is only 33 days out [as of December 26. Editor]! Please be sure to upgrade to version 2.8.5 of our Winter Field Day software in advance, which we've modified for the new Canadian section abbreviations and latest rule changes. In case you missed it in our last announcement, there are several Canadian section abbreviation changes effective January 1, 2023. You won't be able to log these abbreviations or all the categories unless you upgrade.

As always, upgrades are free to registered users. If you are currently running a version of our software released after January 2021 and are Internet connected, it should detect the new upgrade and offer to retrieve it for you on start. If you have any problem with the automatic upgrade, or you are running an older version, you can install the latest version directly from the web site.


