WD8CYV Circuit Does It All

Dave "yeah, roger" Thompson has astounded electronic engineers worldwide with his so-called "Secret-Circuit." Dave claims the circuit does most anything.

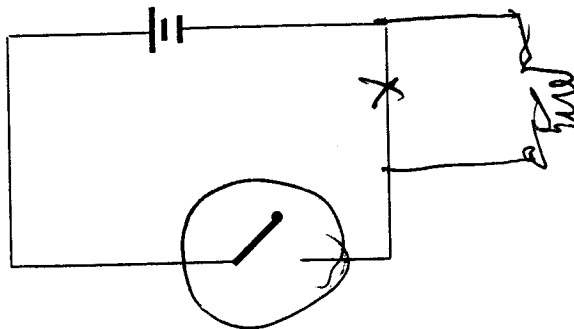
"I first started working on it back in the 60s," Thompson says. "I got the idea from a friend of mine. Marconi was his name. We used to talk to each other on two-meters, back before it was even two-meters. Back in those days, two-meters was only one and three-fourths meters—I mean we're talking the early days."

Thompson suggested several uses for his "Secret-Circuit." "I use this circuit on the '97-machine'. It's programmed to beep at a very shrill frequency when someone needs an extra hand on a project." Thompson added.
