




(above) N8RNY, Cal hammers out "CQ-FD" on 15 and 20-meters.

(below) Georgia serves up the food. Susan serves up a scowl, not at the food, at the photographer.



Get this, the FCC says before any group can become the SCSA they must have at least 1% (that's right one percent) of the members licensed by the FCC.

Rather than trying to explain that, Constitution, Ohio is made up of two cow patties and a haystack that's about 6725 feet up from the Ohio River—just say it's the Parkersburg Amateur Radio Klub repeater. 
