### Do Not Just Complete the Form Top to Bottom

Unless you like to make errors.

Forms impose organization on the medium (printed form on paper, or displayed form on screen).

Forms exist for the purpose of helping a person get information in the right format.

Format is organization of data to support exchange or storage.



### Four Steps In Radio Messaging

#### Origination

Prepare message for relay for someone else.

- (2) To
- (4) From
- (3) Text
- (1) Preamble

Not radio stuff!

#### Relay: Send

Send prepared message from your radio station to another radio station.

#### Relay: Receive

Receive prepared message from another radio station at your radio station.

#### Delivery

Give the written message to the addressee ("To"), so it makes sense to them.

Not radio stuff!



# Origination

Prepare message for relay (usually for someone else).

*Origination* is organizing the thoughts of one person for transmission.

**To** (including how to get it there: phone, physical address, or station).

**From** (including how to reply: phone, physical address, or station).

**Text** (what to say).

Preamble (radio operators).



#### MPG 1.0.2 Example

Shows radiogram form with the "part" (or "block") numbers in parens.

Origination part is in the bottom-left, part 7.

The origination record is so if someone asks how W1AW number 1 (this message) got created, the radio operator has recorded the name and contact information for the person who worked with the operator to make the message.

It also includes date and time, which could show a delay between creating the message and getting it to the sending operator.

There's no "radio stuff" yet.

Completion of the form helps to format the message for transmission.

Completion of the origination part helps to establish the record of where the message came from in the first place.



#### Standard Radiogram Form


What's happening? There is no origination part!

You're right. Use "Received" (RECD) for origination on the standard form

In origination, you received a message and might have asked questions to get complete information for transmission.

Record who gave you the message and how (verbally? in-house phone? written?)...

Record date and time that you got the message.



There's no radio stuff here, so you received it from a person, even if that person is a radio operator. You didn't get it from a station.

If you're a radio operator staffing W8SGT and originate a message that B. Jones verbally gave, you received the message from B. JONES/VERBAL, not from his callsign.




#### A Detail

This isn't a tutorial on origination but her's one other thing to know so you have the concept.

The STATION OF ORIGIN is the station where the message was originated. In our example, it's W8SGT.

This radiogram in the station record at W8SGT clearly was originated for B. JONES, and came in verbally at 1405Z (10:05 A.M. EDT) on July 29.

"Tell them thanks for the coffee before mid-afternoon today!"



Your callsign does not matter. This message was originated at W8SGT.

B. Jones might have a station callsign but it does not matter. This message was received from B. JONES, verbally, and has nothing to do with Jones' station.



#### Message Status?

This message is at station W8SGT.


What is the status of the message?

Unsent, waiting for action at station W8SGT.

How do we know?

It's RECEIVED from someone. It's ORIGINATED at W8SGT. W8SGT is this station. SENT is empty.

This message needs action!



The parts of the radiogram format work together to provide not only accounting after the fact but to show the status of the message as it's being handled.



# Relay

Move the message from one station to another station.

Relay moves the message from one station to another station.

The station that is holding the message must handle it.

The station holding the message will send it to another station.

The station receiving the message now holds it and must handle it.

Accounting happens at each step.



### Relay: Send



#### Relay: Send to W8THV

W8SGT is on a net and lists the traffic for W8OMR COLUMBUS.


W8OMR is not in the net.

Net control directs nearby station W8THV to take message for W8OMR.

W8THV calls W8SGT and receives the message.

W8SGT records station, date, and time saying ROGER (or sending "QSL").

This message at station W8SGT is now handled.



SENT is completed at the time that it "leaves" the station. This shows when W8THV operator said ROGER (or sent QSL). The message is "off" of W8SGT and "on" W8THV.

W8SGT operator should file the message where it stays until policy says. (Not 0 days, also probably not forever.)



#### Relay: Send to W87

W8SGT is on a net and lists W8OMR COLUMBUS.

W80MR is not in the net


Net control directs near take message for W8OMR.

W8THV calls W8SGT and message.

W8SGT records station, date, saying ROGER (or sending "O

### Relay: Receive



# Relay: Receive from W8SGT

W8SGT is on a net and lists the traffic for W8OMR COLUMBUS.


W80MR is not in the net.

Net control directs nearby station W8THV to take message for W8OMR.

W8THV calls W8SGT and receives the message.

W8THV records station, date, and time operator said ROGER (or sending "QSL").

This message now needs action at W8THV.



This message at W8SGT clearly needs action: RECD complete, TO elsewhere, SENT empty

Only three actions allowed:

- 1. Relay to another station
- 2. Delivery to the addressee
- 3. Service (cancel this and originate new) message to STATION OF ORIGIN



### Relay: Send


W8OMR is in the net.

Net control directs W8OMR to take message from W8THV.

W8OMR calls W8THV and receives the message.

# Relay: Receive from W8THV

W8THV is on a net and lists the traffic for W8OMR COLUMBUS.

W8OMR is in the net.

Net control directs W8OMR to take message from W8THV.

W8OMR calls W8THV and receives the message.

W8OMR records station, date, and time operator said ROGER (or sending "QSL").

This message now needs action at W8OMR.

This message at W8OMR clearly needs action:

- 1. RECD from W8THV (a station, i.e., radio)
- 2. TO is some other station
- 3. SENT is empty

Still must relay, deliver, or service.



# Station W8OMR Take Action

W8OMR now has the message.

Station always decides which action to take:

- 1. Relay to another station
- 2. Deliver to the addressee, or
- 3. Service (cancel and notice).

Looking at "addressee" (TO), we see it is directed to this station.

We do not use radio to relay this message further.

We have all information needed here to deliver.

Since we are now delivering, we can now complete part 9 of the radiogram ("THIS MESSAGE WAS RECEIVED AT"), which is not preprinted on this form. Doesn't matter. Goes in the same place.



#### What's The Status?

W8OMR now has the message.

W8OMR can make delivery, no radio relay.

W8OMR has not yet made delivery. SENT part is empty.

W8OMR needs to deliver this message!
Could be by phone if we know it,
Could be hand-delivery or courier,
Could be posted to site message board,
Could be intraoffice mail.

However it will get delivered, we know that delivery has not yet happened.



## Delivery

Give the written message to the addressee ("To"), so it makes sense to them.

*Delivery* takes the relayed message and prepares it for the recipient.

The station that is holding the message must handle it.

No radio stuff!

Accounting continues.



# Delivery: No More Radio

In this example, we deliver via internal email:

To: V.V. Resourceful From: R.T. Operator

Date: Jul 29 11:17:31 EDT (-0400) Subject: Radio Message from Ohio EMA

SGT:

Message for your shop follows. You can send radio response through me. V/R,

R.T. Operator PFC (OH), OHMR

291432Z JUL 20 TO S4/HHC/4 FR B JONES OHIO EMA RECEIVED YOUR COFFEE. IT'S VERY MUCH APPRECIATED; MANY THANKS.

Never just throw a message at the addressee. Calling someone up to say "ARL FIFTY I SPELL FOXTROT INDIA..." does no one any good.

You might attach a copy of the radiogram itself but in any case turn it back into something human readable.

₩hen you make the delivery, it's SENT.

# Delivery: No More Radio

Delivery goes to a person, not a station; this is the complement of origination.

Now the message is "off of" W8OMR, and it can be filed, in accordance with the station policy. Probably not 0 days, but also not forever.



### Recap

All of the parts together

**RECD** is when station receives the message:

Origination if it's from a person

Often not by amateur radio

Relay if it's from a station

Relay if it's from a station

Delivery if it's to a person

Often not by amateur radio



### Question

What if the message came in over amateur radio but was informal?

Informal message (chatter) that results in the creation of a formal message (radiogram) is treated exactly as if a person spoke to a station operator.


Same as email to station operator.

Or phone call to station operator.

Origination is preparing for relay, making the formal message.
