ARRL DIRECTOR'S REPORT Rod Stafford, KB6ZV June, 1987

The following is a list of the videos available in the division.

Amateur Radio's Newest Frontier is good for all groups. It features astronaut W5LFL and K6DUE and the 1983 Columbia flight. (26 mins.)

W5LFL Foothill College Tape is a tape of Owen Garriott's discussion of the shuttle Columbia flight in 1983.

At Any Moment has two versions on one tape, one of 18 minutes suitable for all groups and the second of 26 minutes designed for amateurs.

Amateur TV is a tape demonstration of ATV and what is required to get into ATV. (18 mins.)

Field Day Fever has two versions on one tape. Both are good for general public and hams.

Introduction to Packet Radio is a fairly good presentation of packet radio systems, equipment, protocol, etc.

Lexington/Los Altos Fires contains scenes from the disastrous California fires of 1985 and illustrating ARES in action. (30 mins.)

SAREX with atronaut Tony England, WØORE. Demonstrates ATV and the first two-way ATV transmissions between a spacecraft and earth. Good for all groups.

<u>Terrible</u> <u>Tuesday</u> illustrates the need for pre-disaster planning. Shows the participation of Amateur Radio in disasters.

Wonderful World of Amateur Radio is a somewhat dated but very well done tape of Amateur Radio. Good for general public and features well known personalities who are hams.

gives good Young At Heart а presentation about amateur radio. It a live interview with hams on a TV Thrust of the program is program. toward senior citizens and activities they can pursue. Has been used with good response on local cable ΨV systems.

When requesting a tape, have two possible dates available. Make your request at least two weeks ahead. Tapes are sent via First Class Priority Mail and should be returned the same way.

A number of amateurs involved in Emergency Communications in the Santa Clara Valley have developed a system for finding out the welfare of the family of an emergency responder during a widespread disaster. Its called 'FINDER' which stands for INformation Database Family for Emergency Responders. FINDER is simple to use. Emergency Responders and their families access the service by filling out a simple information at any fire station. card A11 information is keyed to the family's telephone number. Using digital radio techniques and computers, ARES operators can sift through thousands people to find out information of a specific family. about Usina alternate power sources and amateur frequencies, amateurs can provide the FINDER service without tying up critical communications channels or relying on commercial power.




Congress Springs Landscape Yard
