

## Purpose

In April of 2018, YCARES members participated in a Oregon State Simulated Emergency Test (SET) where one of the primary tasks was to exchange Winlink Emails with neighboring counties using radio session modes but via the Peer-to-Peer protocols. Prior to this SET, several practice sessions were performed, initially between members within YCARES, and then with a few members of ARES groups with counties to our south. It did not go without notice that this was a learning experience for all.

On the day of the SET, it quickly became noticeable that those who had participated in the practice sessions quickly became informal instructors for those who hadn't. And coordination with other counties did not go as well as was expected. Several found that they had old versions of Winlink Express at their EOC's or personal systems, and a few found their personal Winlink accounts had expired due to not being used within the 400 day time limit.

One of the topics discussed in hot wash immediately after the set, was to initiate a Winlink Net for continuous training. While it may have not been an equitable trade due to the level of my time it requires, I took on the role as Net Control for the Winlink Net, with the expectation I didn't have to be in the Net Control rotation for the the Monday YCARES VHF/UHF voice net.

It has been rewarding as I've become even more knowledge on the operation of Winlink Express as well as RMS Station operation

- On June 3rd, 2018, the first Winlink Net Call for Check-Ins was sent out.
- We had a total of 8 check-ins.

• For the April 25<sup>th</sup>, 2021 Call for Check-Ins, we had 43 participants, and with the some participants checking in several times using different modes or RMS Stations a total of 57 Check-Ins.

In November of 2018, one of your Washington County ARES members requested to join after discovering I was performing this net from a topic in the Groups.io Winlink Forum He was welcomed him and others as they found out by word of mouth or other Internet email groups.

### Check-In Period

With this net, you have from Sunday Morning's to Friday Midnight for you to send your check-in to me.

On Sunday mornings I send out a Conventional Winlink message that proclaims that week's Call for Check-Ins.

# Check-In Message

Most check-ins of the month I'm just looking for a conventional Winlink message with the one line check-in. The third week, I usually ask for the check-in to be in the form of an ICS-213.

The Check-in message can be presented on the Subject line, or within the body of the message.

### One Line Check-In message

All Check-Ins should include the online Check-In message

- For radio mode check-ins please include:
  - Your Call Sign, Mode, RMS Station Call Sign, Dial Frequency, County, and State.
  - Expected Modes are APRS, ARDOP, ARDOP P2P, PACKET, PACKET DIGI, PACKET P2P, PACTOR I, PACTOR II, PACTOR III, PACTOR P2P, PACTOR RO, VARA, VARA 500, VARA FM, VARA FM DIGI, VARA FM P2P, VARA P2P, VARA RO
- For Internet related check-ins, please include:
  - Your Call Sign, Mode, County, and State.
  - Expected Modes are Telnet, WebMail, Mesh, and APRS
- My Check-In for the 152 Session of the YCARES Winlink Net was
  - W7OWO, VARA, N0SA, 3.5860, Yamhill, Oregon

#### **HF Station Selection Aids**

- Some participants who use HF modes have questioned my request of RMS Station Name and Frequency as propagation may prevent access or maybe the frequency is busy.
- I see this as a training item. I and others have created a list of HF RMS stations, the band, and the time of day that we've made good connections, I usually use that list to find what will work for me before I do check-ins to other nets.
- Also the Winlink.org website has some tools I use as well
  - RMS Map
    - Provides a US Map of all active RMS Stations by Mode
  - Propogation Map
    - Shows for up to a 48 hour period all Winlink RMS Station connections. I use this combined with my list to select the stations I use.

# Acknowledgment & Map

- If you request and acknowledgment as part of your Check-In I will provide one, but by default I do not.
- I consider the logging of your Map entry as my acknowledgment.
- Though, if you ask a question I will usually provide a reply.
- When I request the check-in to be within the message text of an ICS-213, I usually will reply to that ICS-213.
- Occasionally, the Call For Check-Ins will be in an ICS-213 and I will request you provide your check-in message within the Reply to my ICS-213. In these cases I usually acknowledge this ICS-213.

## Check-In Map

- Throughout the week as I receive the check-ins I log the results and produce an interactive map webpage that contains the participant's location and if they used a radio mode, the RMS Station's location.

### Check-In Roster

- On Saturday mornings I produce a check-in Roster that lists all the check-ins and statistics of the check-ins
- This is within a conventional Winlink message, I usually get it sent out prior to 9:00 am Saturday.
- They are usually listed in the order the check-in was received.
