Harry joined the Reading Radio Club in 1976. He was a life member of the RRC as well. He was the oldest living member of the RRC.

Harry's call sign, W3VBY is one of the oldest non-vanity, FCC issued call signs.

Harry was RRC President in 1994, 1995, 1996, 2001 and 2002.

Harry has been the RRC secretary since 2003 when Al Brailer, W3UQC passed away. Harry has done a great job keeping track and writing up the board of director and general meeting notes since.

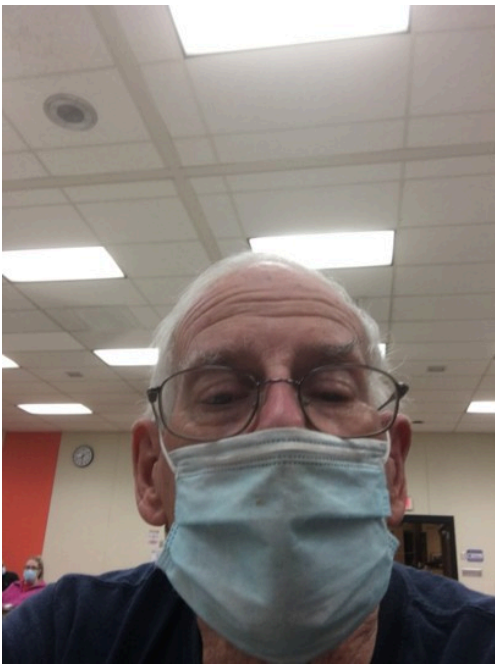
Harry handled all the details in reserving the Train Station and the Agricultural Center year after year.

Harry William Hoffman Jr. W3VBY

May 12, 1936-March 25, 2024

Harry Hoffman Jr. couldn't wait to join his beloved wife, Lydia, in heaven! Just 32 days after her passing, he made it. He born in Philadelphia the son of Harry and Alberta (née Reeves). A very precocious child, the doctor told his parents the only way to calm him down was to have another child! Enter his brother, John. Whether it ever slowed him down is debatable, but Harry did gain a lifelong friend.

Harry met the love of his life, Lydia, the summer before 4th grade in a music camp. He came home that night and told his parents there was "a cute little girl with chubby cheeks and braids playing the clarinet who couldn't play a note." Harry & Lydia were inseparable for the next 77 years. His deep love and commitment to her was evident to all.

Harry earned an Associates Degree in Electronics from Temple University. He then traveled the world with the Naval Air Reserve from 1953-1961. At one point, he filled his Douglas R5D Spymaster transport plane with Christmas trees from Berks County. They flew them halfway around the world and distributed them to all the US Naval ships in port! He retired with a rank of P.O. 2nd Class Electronics Technician.

Harry had a fulfilling career in fiber optics with Bell Labs for 30 years. He also worked at GAI-Tronics for ten years as a Communication Equipment Engineer.

Known by the HAM radio community by his call sign, W3VBY, Harry was a very active member of the Reading Radio Club. Over the years, he held the positions of President, Secretary, and Volunteer Exam Coordinator. He really enjoyed mentoring people to pass their exam. He particularly loved participating in HAM Fest and Field Day every year!

Some of his other favorite things were Reese's Peanut Butter Cups, the great outdoors, reptiles, and getting into trouble with his four grandchildren. He was the kind of guy who could never sit still and loved working with his hands. He would often enjoy helping with repairs on his sons' rental properties and stepping in for anyone who needed a handyman.

Harry was also very involved with his church, Calvary Baptist. For years, he served on the Missions Committee and ran sound during services.

Sharing his abiding faith in Jesus Christ was truly his lifelong passion though. For sixty years, he and his wife, Lydia, worked with Child Evangelism Fellowship holding Good News Clubs for local children. He was the Chairman of the Committee for CEF of Reading & Berks County, serving on the Committee since 1963. He even attended his last meeting just a few days before he passed! He was also well known in Reading for his Dial-A-Story programs and as a leader of Boys Brigade at church. In his life, he embodied their motto, "Sure & Steadfast."

Left to keep his memory alive are his sons David, Mark (Helene), Paul (Sarah), four devoted grandchildren, his brother John (Nancy), sister-in-law Margaret "Peggy" Thorndike (Richard), nieces and nephews, and hundreds of people whose lives he's spoken in to over the decades.

A memorial will be held at Calvary Baptist Church, 510 Park Ave., Reading, PA 19611 on Friday, April 5th. Visitation from 9 AM-11:00 AM. Service at 11:30 PM. The burial will be held afterwards in a private family service at Memory Gardens in Ephrata.

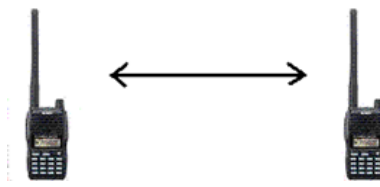

RAIN NO BOTHER FOR SIMPLEX RADIO TEAM, CHECKINS

A steady rain was no threat to the Reading Radio Club-sponsored Simplex Radio Test on Saturday afternoon March 9.

We had a good group of net control operators positioned on the parking lot of the Reading-Muhlenberg Vo-Tech School adjacent to Route 12 – the Pricetown Road – and just at the bottom of the mountain from the Reading Radio Club repeater site.

We had 24 check-ins on the 146.550 Megahertz VHF side of the ledger with stations sounding strong and reporting good copy of the net control station. There were 14 stations checking in on 406 Megahertz Simplex or 70 centimeters.

Thanks to Al K3AJM and Ron K3RJW for their outstanding professional work as primary net controls. I was there simply as a back-up.

We also had Stewart W2SLH make some contacts toward his Pagoda Award. Very nice! Thanks to the RRC members who stayed on to help him! It was easy! Why not get in on the fun of chasing the Pagoda Award?

The next Simplex Radio Test for Berks County will be Saturday, April 13, 2024 at 1 p.m. local time.

We are still working to establish a location.

Finally, a big reminder about the Multi-County Simplex Radio Test for Saturday, May 11, 2024 at 1 p.m. We'll be setting up at the William Penn Memorial Fire Tower and putting out a big signal soliciting stations from Berks and surrounding counties to join in the activity.

Remember, you don't have to be a member of the Reading Radio Club to participate in the Simplex Radio Test. The purpose is to test our preparedness as licensed amateurs in the event the repeaters in our area go down and we are needed to set up emergency communications.

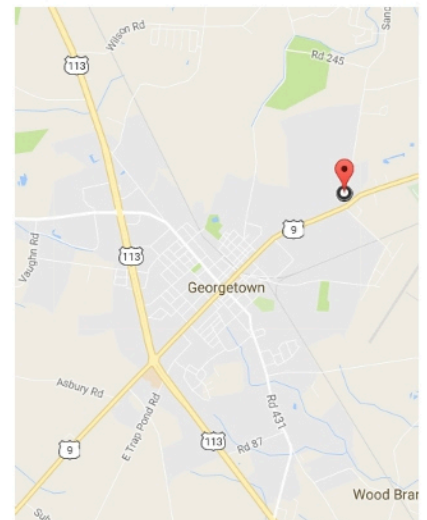

POTA EVENT SHOWCASES TOP OPERATORS IN EPA REGION

In what is being described as a first-of-its-kind event in the region, four top Parks on the Air Activators from eastern Pennsylvania will be setting up stations in Evansburg State Park in nearby Montgomery County between Collegeville and Norristown later this month.

Their goal: To demonstrate how to set up and operate a POTA station as an activator and draw attention to one of the fastest growing activities in amateur radio today.

They're inviting hams from across the region to come out and learn more about POTA and what they'll need to do to get on the air from a park.

The POTA Extravaganza is being put together by the Pottstown Area Amateur Repeater Club and will be held on Sunday, April 28 from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. in Evansburg Park picnic Pavilion A.

Walt Skavinsky, KB3SBC, president of PAARC and a veteran POTA activator himself with more than 3,000 QSOs made from nearly 150 activations in 91 parks, is spearheading the event.

Skavinsky says whether you're a seasoned operator or just getting started, the event will offer something for everyone.

Skavinsky has "booked" a group of top operators he calls "The League of Extraordinary POTAMEN" to activate their call signs from Evansburg State Park.

The four are Pete Kobak K0BAK, Greg Malone WA3GM, Joel Rubincam NF3R, and Bill Hewitt W3FRB.

Kobak, K0BAK lives in Oaks, Montgomery County. He was first licensed in 2013 and immediately caught the contest bug for HF and VHF events, including mobile and roving in the PA QSO Party and other state parties.

He was among the pioneer amateur radio operators who jumped into the National Parks on the Air initiative through the American Radio Relay League in 2016. He later took part in Canada's version of POTA – Canadian National Parks on the Air in 2019, activating the third most number of parks in Canada despite being six hours from the nearest border.

Kobak has activated 500 different parks in 14 U.S. states and 5 Canadian provinces. He also holds certificates for activating all POTA sites in Delaware and New Jersey and Washington D.C.

He is not only an avid activator but also a prolific hunter contacting more than 3,500 unique parks from home and making contact with parks in all U.S. states.

Kobak's current POTA stats show 980 activations in 515 parks, amassing 37,891 contacts. As a hunter, he has contacted 3,626 parks logging 7,625 QSOs.

He has had articles about his amateur radio activities published in QST, the National Contest Journal, and CQ Magazine.

Malone WA3GM, is from Horsham, Montgomery County. He has been licensed for more than 35 years and has been active on the HF and VHF bands, earning recognition for his achievements.

He did stints as president of the Phil-Mont Mobile Radio Club and Holmesburg Amateur Radio Club, both in the Philadelphia area.

Malone has more than 280 POTA activations from 36 parks logging 14,144 contacts. He is also an active POTA hunter logging more than 3,400 QSOs with operators in 1,715 parks.

His most recent activations were Sebastian Inlet State Park in Florida in March, and Archie Carr National Wildlife Refuge and Canaveral National Seashore, both in Florida in February.

Rubincam NF3R, lives in Pottstown and is an active HF and DX contester and member of the Frankford Radio Club.

He also holds the call sign ZF2RJ in the Cayman Islands and last operated from the North side in January of this year.

His POTA stats show 36 activations from eight parks and 4,862 contacts. As an active POTA hunter, Rubincam amassed 3,277 QSOs with stations in 1,587 parks.

He has worked all states and all Canadian provinces.

Rubincam's most recent activation was Big Pocono State Park in mid-March.

Hewitt W3FRB is from Pottstown and he has been licensed since 2010.

He is the founder of the Education Alliance for Amateur Radio and is a member of the Pottstown Area Amateur Radio Club, East Penn Amateur Radio Club, and Phil-Mont Radio Club.

Hewitt has 36 POTA activations at 17 parks amassing 715 contacts. As a hunter, he has made 216 QSOs with stations in 175 parks.

His most recent activation was in French Creek State Park in January.

Skavinsky, who reports he is working on one more surprise guest POTA operator, is promising an extraordinary ham radio adventure for those who come out for the one-day event at Evansburg State Park.
