# **RRC Purpose & Accomplishments 2021**

The Reading Radio Club, Inc. has been in existence for over 99 years. It was formed during the early years of radio experimentation. The RRC has an IRS 501(c)(3) tax status. Many of its members have contributed greatly to the development of Radio, television, emergency communications, and the electronic industry over this period of time.

Amateur Radio people (called "hams") are well known for our communications support in disaster and post-disaster situations. We also provide communication services to the public during special events.

We are called "amateurs" because we are not paid. Our services are provided at no charge. Like amateur sports, we do it for the love of it! We may be called "amateurs" but our communications services are professional.

Amateurs and their equipment can interface with both public safety efforts and event organizers.

Our equipment can be made operational quickly inside a building, in a mobile command post or out in the field.

There are over 700,000 Amateur Radio operators in the United States and 3 million worldwide. To get your Amateur Radio License you need to take a 35-question, multiple choice exam. The Reading Radio Club Volunteer Examiner Team is certified by the Federal Communications Commission and has administered 103 such Amateur Radio Test Sessions over the past 36 years. We have processed 893 candidates during this period. Many of them have gone on to earn advanced licenses and chosen electronics as their career as a result of the training administered by the Reading Radio Club members.

We hold weekly on the air testing of our equipment and are available at a moments notice in case of an emergency. Our local repeater system covers a radius of about 30 miles. We would like to add emergency power to our repeater system.

We have a monthly Radio Club Bulletin which covers upcoming events and educational subjects on technical issues. Many of our members make do it yourself projects. Some have helped local science teachers with projects, such as balloon launch and tracking by radio, etc.

Our monthly Reading Radio Club meetings are open to all, young and old. Membership is not a requirement. We show educational videos, have group and individual discussions, etc. Members are able and willing to help, especially with technical help.

I hope this gives an idea of what the Reading Radio Club does and how it contributes to the local community.

# **CLEAN UP** - At the REPEATER site on OCT. 23, 2021

During a visit to the RRC W3BN, 146.91 MHz, repeater site, on Wednesday Sept. 15, 2021; one of our ninety-degree days! We found the entrance to the building blocked by an unbelievable overgrowth of vegetation of all varieties. Some growth as tall as twenty feet!

We were unprepared for this situation being dress in short sleeve shirts, shorts, and sneakers. Not having the equipment to tackle the overgrowth, we did not enter the building and went home.

The last clean-up of the repeater site property was done on Tuesday July 21, 2015. Eight members cleared the property of debris that consisted of low growth vegetation, fallen leaves, and a few one-inch diameter early growth trees. Check out the picture below of the property taken 11-02-2019. As you can see the growth in four years was moderate and of a low level.

The rapid growth in less than two years is amazing. The hot temperatures of the last few summers along with more than adequate rainfall has stimulated super growth of all types of weeds.

# RRC MEETING ON THE AIR (RRCMOTA)

Check into the <u>RRC MEETING ON THE AIR</u> on the Friday evenings that we do not have an in-person meeting. The net, on 146.910 MHz, starts at 8:00 p.m. with the latest AMATEUR RADIO NEWSLINE REPORT from the West Coast.

We then have an exchange of information that may be of interest to the members of the Reading Radio Club as well as those that are not RRC members.

The last part of the net is a roll call where we usually have 13 to 56 stations check-in and test their two-meter FM analog equipment. The roll call is last, so that late comers are not missed.

**NOTE:** The Continuous Tone Coded Squelch System, (CTCSS) frequency is 131.8 Hertz (3B). The CTCSS is often referred to as "PL" (Motorola's trade name).

The net has been in operation since Friday January 21, 1994, when we had 13 check-ins during that first session, over 27 years ago.

On Friday September 24, 2021, we had session number 1173. Dave Wiley, K3MXS, was the Net Control.

The next RRCMOTA will be on Friday October 1, 2021, starting at 8:00 p.m., on the Reading Radio Club's 146.910 MHz, W3BN analog repeater. Rich Ahrens, W3WJC, will be the Net Control for session number 1174.
