The older WinHelp is still available if you download the WinHelp32.exe file found at Microsoft's WinHlp32.

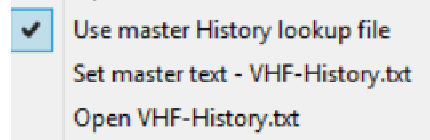

Using the VHF-History.txt file and cklist.dat:

Several look-up files are available at the

<http://qsl.net/w3km/updates.zip> link from the VHFLOG web page.

To use the VHF-History.txt file, in the VHFLOG File menu, select the {Use} checkbox. Then click {Set} and lastly click {Open} (opens in NotePad), to verify it works.
