

It's amazing how time flies. A couple of months ago, I started my 55th year with an Amateur Radio license. I got interested in getting a license about 4 years before that, but the nearest Amateur Radio operators were about 30 miles from me. I didn't know them except to listen on the old floor model Philco radio. I listened to the 75 meter AM phone band back before the days of SSB. I had a cousin, W4QI, in Siler City about 180 away from my home. He encouraged me but it was slow going since I didn't have anything to copy code on until about a year before I got my license. Check out the web site I made about him at www. qsl.net/w4ydy/w4qi.html.

I finally went to Norfolk and that was about 150 miles away and

passed the Novice and Technician exams. Got on the air a little over 2 months later on December 25, 1952. Aurora was on the air and probably never the same again! Still had to finish high school about 6 months later.

As far as time flying, there is another anniversary coming up on December 15. That was the day WRAL-TV in Raleigh signed on the air 50 years ago. I had gone to work there about 8 days earlier and all the technicians were working about 80 hours a week to make the deadline. We did it but it was close. Two of us spent 5 days installing all the audio wiring and finished by wiring up the turntables for the announcer at 10 AM. We signed on 2 hours later.

I took some movies with my mother's 8mm camera a couple of months later and also took a few slides of the station in 1956, 57 and 59. I told the folks at the station about them in late November and they were happy to get copies. Some will be posted on their web site and some will be used on the air I was told. Already one slide made the airways and the web site. If you are interested, go to www.wral.com and play

back the Christmas tower lighting show they did on December 1 and the slide show. The show is 30 minutes long but the 1959 tower slide is shown during the first 2 minutes of the show. It is a picture of the first Christmas tower lights in 1959. That was a tall 250 foot "tree". They have replaced it with a 300 foot tower.

The station has a special tower lighting program every year now but the first year in 1959, the tower Christmas lights were just installed and turned on. I had the job of turning them off 5 nights a week when I closed down and locked up the studios. Just went in the basement and pulled the big switch. I don't know how many watts the lights took but I'm glad I didn't have to pay the light bill!

FCC "Omnibus" Amateur Radio R&O Published in Federal Register, Takes Effect December 15



NEWINGTON, CT (November 15, 2006) -- Just a little over a month after the Federal Communications Commission released

the Report and Order (R&O) in the socalled "Omnibus" Amateur Radio proceeding, WT Docket 04-140 (FCC 06-149) to the public, a revised version appeared in the Federal Register. The changes in the R&O will take effect Friday, December 15, at 12:01 AM EST, 30 days after its publication.

As expected, the Report & Order as published this morning clarified two items that had raised some concerns when it was first released last month: That the 80/75 meter band split applies to all three IARU Regions, and that FCC licensees in Region 2, which includes North America,

can continue to use RTTY/data emissions in the 7.075-7.100 MHz band.

Still to be resolved are three controversial aspects of the Proceeding:

- * Expansion of the 75 meter phone band all the way down to 3600 kHz (thus reducing the privileges of General, Advanced and Amateur Extra class licensees, who had RTTY/data privileges in the 80 meter band, and CW privileges of General and Advanced class licensees)
- * The elimination of J2D emissions, data sent by modulating an SSB transmitter, of more than 500 Hz bandwidth. This will make PACTOR III at full capability illegal. Other digital modes effectively rendered illegal below 30 MHz include Olivia and MT63 (when operated at bandwidths greater than 500 Hz), 1200-baud packet, Q15X25 and Clover 2000.
- * The elimination of access to the automatic control RTTY/data subband at 3620-3635 kHz. (See Page 4 Correction)

The ARRL Board is discussing the possibility of a petition to reconsider several items in the R&O.

ARRL Regulatory Information Specialist Dan Henderson, N1ND, commented: "The release of the R&O in the Federal Register has started the count-down clock. We are all looking forward to being able to use the refarmed frequencies starting on December 15. We are still anxiously awaiting the release of the Report and Order for 05-235, the Morse Code Proceeding. We are hopeful that the Commission will be able to move on that petition and address the outstanding issues in the Omnibus R&O soon."



Amateur Radio exam question pools altered to agree with new rules


With numerous new FCC Part 97 rules soon going into effect, the National Conference of Volunteer Examiner Coordinators' (NCVEC) Question Pool Committee (QPC) has dropped two dozen questions from the three Amateur Radio examination question pools. The deletions will bring ham radio license exams offered starting December 15 into line with rule changes spelled out in the recent FCC "omnibus" Report and Order (R&O) in WT Docket 04-140. ARRL VEC Manager Maria Somma, AB1FM, says ARRL VECsponsored examination sessions will go forward without interruption.

"ARRL VEC will not be replacing any of our exam booklets affected by the WT 04-140 rule changes," Somma said. "We will, instead, be using stickers to substitute alternate questions. The stickers will contain valid questions to place in the exam booklets to cover up the deleted questions." The stickers will go out by December 15 to ARRL VEC volunteer examiner teams that have been formally field stocked.

The QPC cut just one question from the Technician question pool, 13 from the General pool and 10 from the Amateur Extra pool. Changes in rules governing frequency privileges and external RF power amplifier standards accounted for the lion's share of the questions cut from the General and Amateur Extra pools.

Somma says that while questions G1D01 and E1F04 remain largely correct, they're being removed at this time because they do not meet current standards for the degree of completeness or accuracy the QPC desires of exam questions. - via ARRL Letter Online 12/2/06

The Association for Maximum Service Television (MSTV) and the National Association of Broadcasters (NAB) have filed a joint motion for leave to intervene in support of the ARRL in its court appeal of the Federal Communications Commission's Broadband over Power Line (BPL) rules.

The motion to the US Court of Appeals for the District of Columbia Circuit is dated November 9 and states: "MSTV and NAB believe that the regulations under review are arbitrary, capricious, and contrary to law, and will adversely impact their members by, among other things, permitting unlicensed users of radio spectrum to interfere with licensed uses of the spectrum."

MSTV and NAB are entitled to ◆ intervene as a matter of right, so the Court is expected to grant the motion. As expected, some BPL proponents are seeking to intervene on the side of the FCC. ◆
