

In early March, I participated in the Idaho QSO Party. Made a few contacts on 20 meter SSB and CW. It turned out there were only about 6 of their 44 counties on the air. Oklahoma also had a OSO party that same weekend and it was very busy with most of the 77 counties on the air. I was looking for Washington County, ID but it was not on this year. I only need Washington County to finish Idaho for the third time. Guess I will have to wait until someone goes there mobile.

What was most surprising while I was working Idaho stations, I heard W4TVI in Boise, ID (Ada County). I contacted him and asked if he had always had that call sign. He said he had and he said my call was familiar. Jim and I talked for 5 or 10 minutes. I remember his call sign because TVI was a major problem in the 50's as many transmitters back then did not have TVI prevention in them.

Anyway, Jim had retired in Boise, Hope the BARC ID and when we use to talked from 1953 to 1958, he was living in Halifax, VA. He went to NCSU in the late 50's and that was when I was also living in Raleigh. We talked a couple of times when he was operating portable in Raleigh. We had met again after last making a contact with each other 50 years earlier. All the contacts were on AM and only the last time I talked to him, I was using SSB. Not sure if he was on AM or SSB since I didn't log the mode of the other station.

> Back in the 50's most stations were still on AM so the many times you would hear stations talking together and some would be on AM and others on SSB. Since I had the first SSB station in Wake County, it was lonely if I didn't contact AM stations. Since most of my operation was ragchewing on 75 meters, I had many friends and they would tune in my SSB signal.

Proposed Changes to BARC Constitution

The second, and final planned update of the BARC Constitution was presented to the membership at the March membership meeting. The proposed changes originated with a committee consisting of Dave Pulver, KG4CZV, Bernie Nobles, WA4MOK, Dave Langley, W4YDY, and John McCoy, K4KBB.

Before being presented to the membership, the proposals were reviewed by the Executive Board at their January and February meetings.

The proposed Constitution can be viewed at the BARC web site. Changes are highlighted in Green. The existing Constitution is also on the web site for comparisons.

Some of the changes were superficial in nature. Titles were added to the headers in Sections II and III. Changes were also made to make all references to meetings uniform throughout the document (i.e. membership meeting, executive board meeting).

The remaining changes are either to reword existing rules for clarity, or to implement a new procedure. Please make sure you read Section IX, as this is the biggest change in the Constitution.

A vote will be held at the April membership meeting. Should two-thirds of the members present vote in favor of these changes, the proposed changes will be adopted and put in place.

This is the third year that BARC will be participating in this event. The event has proven to be a good opportunity to practice use of tactical call signs and exercise of handheld equipment.



Directions to Boy Scout Camp Bonner North

Camp Bonner North is located East of Washington, NC. These directions are from Washington starting at the intersection of US17 and US264.

From US 17, go 6.4 miles on US264, a four lane highway to NC32. At NC32, the four lane ends so stay in the right lane and turn right. Go 1.33 miles and turn left onto Harvey Road. At 1.1 miles, turn right into Camp Bonner North, a dirt road in the woods. There is a sign at the entrance. There is an open field on the right just before the Camp entrance. Go 0.44 miles and the shelter is on the right where N4S will be located. It will be the 2nd shelter on the right on the dirt road.


