

The ARRL Simulated Emergency Test is a nationwide exercise in emergency communications, administered by ARRL Field Organization Leaders. Amateur Radio Emergency Service (ARES), National Traffic System (NTS), and other publicservice oriented groups can be involved. The SET weekend gives communicators the opportunity to focus on the emergencycommunications capability within your community while interacting with NTS

The purpose of the SET is to find out the strengths and weaknesses of our emergency plans and groups providing emergency communications. It is also an opportunity to provide a public demonstration of the value of Amateur Radio to served agencies such as the American Red Cross, emergency management, through the news media.

The SET also helps radio amateurs gain experience in communications using standard procedures and a variety of modes under simulated-emergency conditions. This year's North Carolina SET will be held on Saturday, October 3 and the Tarheel Emergency Net will be on the air to support local SET exercises. - via NC Section News, Tim Slay, N4IB


