BARC Meeting Minutes - November 10, 2009

Call to Order: Bob Moore, N4USB, called the meeting to order at 7:35 pm. The Pledge of Allegiance was led by Tom Parsons, W4TEP. Introductions were made. There were 23 members present and all signed into the book.

Minutes: The October minutes were approved as published in the October issue of the Ham Chatter.

Secretary's report: Nothing to report

Treasurer's Report: Dave Pulver, KG4CZV, gave the report. Further information regarding the treasurer's report is available to members upon request.

Health and welfare: Albert Sanchez, WA7FXB, announced that Tom Parsons, W4TEP, is feeling much better and is attending the meeting.

Paul Copeland, K4KCS, sent an email stating that his wife will be going into the Heart Center Thursday evening for a Heart Catheterization Friday morning.

Byron Highland, K4BMH, said that he had talked to Tim Nelson. Tim is back to work and will be starting chemotherapy this week. Bernie Nobles, WA4MOK, reported that Tim had also spent 5 more days in the hospital and will also be undergoing radiation treatments.

Public Service: Pat Williams, KG4NSC, reported that there will be an event called Dash for Cash on December 6 at the Town Commons. There will be a 5K and a 10 mile course. It starts at 11 am. There will be a volunteer meeting on December 5 at the Willis Building. Volunteers will be used as Ham communications. A call for volunteers was held and 6 members volunteered. If you are interested in volunteering, please contact Pat.

Programs: The BARC Annual Christmas Party is scheduled for December. The social will begin at 6:30 with dinner at 7:00. A meeting with annual awards will begin at 7:30. Members may bring a guest and are to bring a dish to share.

Volunteer Examiners: Ted Bertrand, KI4WPX, announced that the next exam will be held on Friday, December 11 at St. Peter's School at 6:30 pm.

State ARES: Bernie Nobles, WA4MOK, reported that there was a statewide ARES meeting on October 17 in Morganton. Three people attended from the Eastern Branch. Items discussed were the ICS-213 message format, Winlink, MARS and NIMS courses. North Carolina has mandated that all 100 counties must be NIMS compliant. There will be two membership lists with the EC, one of those credited with the ICS 100, 200, 400 and 800 courses and those not accredited. A statewide database will be instated to upload certificates of members.

Eastern Branch ARES: The UHF Washington repeater is on line. The Downeast Linking System is on line – 442.550 with a PL 82.5, and the 2 meter machine 146.955 with a PL 32.5.

This Saturday, November 14, the areas 1 and 2 meeting will be held in Plymouth at the Golden Skillet. On the agenda is John Sprouse, N4VJJ, Beaufort County EC, talking about the new repeaters in Beaufort County and how they will interact with the rest of the system. Bernie will talk also about the Statewide ARES meeting.

Pitt County ARES: Dave Pulver, KG4CZV, reported. The SET (Simulated Emergency Test) was held on October 31. The ICS213 message forms were practiced. 14 members checked in and 11 actively participated. 21 pieces of traffic was passed in the 2 hours of the test.

The quarterly meeting of Pitt County ARES will be on Wednesday, November 18 at 7:30 pm.
