





Pitt County ARES Responds to Hurricane Irene



On August 27, 2011, Hurricane Irene came ashore east of Morehead City, at Cape Lookout as a category 1 storm. In anticipation of this event, Pitt County activated three shelters - D.H. Conley High School, Farmville Central High School and Wellcome Middle School.

Pitt County ARES was active for 16 hours during the day, providing communications between the shelters, Red Cross, PCMH and Pitt County EOC. The following ARES members participated at the following locations:

In the end, each of the challenges that was faced by the various operators was worked with or around and the mission was successfully completed.

Many thanks go out these operators who took time away from their families and property to serve the community. Thanks also to the many ARES operators who checked into the net and provided storm information to those operating in these locations who were lacking the ability to get storm information.
