BARC member, Bill Finch, W4EHF, was awarded the Order of the Long Leaf Pine by Governor Beverly Perdue for his service to Amateur Radio and his work in emergency communications and radio nets. Bill is still active in the traffic nets every week. It was presented to him by North Carolina Section Manager Bill Morine, N2COP, at the RARSFest April 7, 2012 at the beginning of the ARRL Division meeting. Weldon Fields, W4AJT, Greensboro, also received the award. Morine remarked that there was a lot of Amateur Radio experience between Bill, age 100, and Weldon, age

98. Bill was licensed in 1935 and Weldon was licensed in 1930 for a total of 159 years between the two.

The Order of the Long Leaf Pine is among the most prestigious awards presented by the Governor of North Carolina. The Order of the Long Leaf Pine is presented to individuals who have a proven record of extraordinary service to the state. Contributions to their communities, extra effort in their careers, and many years of service to their organizations are some of the guidelines by which recipients are selected for this award.

Bill had a few remarks at the end of the ceremony thanking everyone for their help and about his love of North Carolina even when he was away. Bill remarked that he was born in Raleigh and always looked forward to returning to North Carolina even though he was not gone for long. 

Johnnie Edmondson, W4GDN, SK

I was very sorry to see that Johnnie Edmondson, W4GDN, passed away on April 13. I enjoyed working with him in 1956 at the old WITN-TV transmitter site in Grifton. Johnnie worked part time some at the transmitter site after his day at the Grifton Railroad Station. I was working there when we were down to just one supervisor and one technician after the second technician resigned. Johnnie came in to help out until another technician was hired but he stayed on part time for a while. At that time in the early days of the TV station, it was only on the air from 1 PM to 11:30 PM each day so only a couple manual notch function, digital twin pass of technicians were required.

Since I was always off in the mornings, I would sometimes go to the Grifton railroad station and visit with Johnnie. Sometimes while I was there, the sounder on the telegraph would cut loose and Johnnie would copy the message and reply with a short burst. Of course, he was using the American Morse code and it was foreign to me! Hey - That was one of the questions Terry, K4ZYD, used at the last meeting in his first annual Great Ham Radio Trivia Challenge. I got that one right!

By the time Johnnie started his part time work at WITN-TV, I had set up a ham station at the transmitter site. Wish I had a picture of it. When I decided that I would like to put a station there, the station manager signed the form that I would send to the FCC. I sent it to the FCC and asked if I should just operate portable using **W4YDY** or would I get a second call sign. Back then, if you wanted to operated a station away from the official station location, you had to notify the FCC in the district of the mobile or portable operation if more

than 24 hours. A few weeks later, I received a Second Station call sign, K4IWJ. I set up my Hallicrafters SX-71 receiver and Heathkit DX-100 AM transmitter next to the TV transmitter console. I installed a 75 meter dipole with a 10 meter loosely below it using the same transmission line. I hooked one end with a loop over the tower guy wire that was 300 feet up tower. I tied a ball of twine to it and threw the ball to the ground. Tied the other end of the dipole to the tower at the 120 foot level. When I pulled it down the guy wire, it was a perfect flattop at 120 feet! My signal was weak in central NC, but in the NC mountain area, they thought I was running a KW! It sure had a low angle of radiation. When Johnnie was there, I was able to talk to K4IWJ from W4YDY. We both enjoyed the station on our breaks.

BARC Field Day to be at ECU W Research Campus




The Brightleaf Amateur Radio Club will hold Field Day at the former VOA Site C. now the ECU West Research Campus. Roads to the site are in the map at the right.

WPX Awards via LoTW Enters Beta Testing

Earlier this year, the ARRL and CQ Communications announced that the ARRL will provide support for CQ-sponsored operating awards by the ARRL's Logbook of the World (LoTW) electronic confirmation system. The WPX Award is the first of the CQ-sponsored awards that LoTW will support.

"We had originally planned to introduce this new program in early April, but due to the introduction of the new DXCC fee structure and our new Online DXCC application, we had to push the date back," explained ARRL Chief Operating Officer Harold Kramer, WJ1B. "We are now beta testing the program with a select group of hams and are looking forward to launching to LoTW-WPX partnership in the first part of Mav."

The ARRL's LoTW system -- an interactive database recording contacts between radio amateurs -- was created in 2003 and has been adopted by almost 50,000 radio amateurs worldwide. It already has records of more than 400 million contacts and VHF is growing weekly. Amateurs will be able to use LoTW logs to generate lists of confirmed contacts to be submitted for WPX credit. Standard LoTW credit fees and CQ award fees will apply.

ARRL Chief Executive Officer David Sumner, K1ZZ, observed that this step gives radio amateurs throughout the world an inexpensive and convenient means of gaining credits toward CQ's popular operating awards. "LoTW has significantly increased interest and participation in the ARRL's DXCC, Worked All States and VUCC awards programs," he said when the partnership was announced. "We anticipate a similarly positive response to the addition of the CQ WPX award. Amateurs will be able to spend more time operating and less time chasing QSL cards."

CQ President Richard Ross, K2MGA, said he is very pleased to be able to . move forward with LoTW support for CQ awards. "We have had excellent results with electronic confirmations for several years," he explained. "I am glad that we are now able to begin expanding that convenience to those participants in our award programs who use Logbook of The World. We look forward to a smooth launch for WPX and to the expansion of LoTW support to include the rest of our award programs, as well."

2012 Continues to Show Growth in Amateur Radio Licensing

The first quarter of 2012 (January-March) saw a high level of Amateur Radio license exam sessions, producing an elevated influx of applications for new licensees. According to ARRL VEC Manager Maria Somma, AB1FM, these numbers outpaced the 2011 first quarter results by 30 percent. This uptick does not only apply to new applications; there was a 6 percent increase in the number of upgrades, too. "Statistics over the last 13 years reveal that these are the highest numbers that we've ever seen for the total number of US amateurs," Somma said. "Now there are more than 704,000 radio amateurs in the US."

Somma said that there are currently 704,236 licensed Amateur Radio operators in the US. "We broke the 700,000 barrier in October 2011," she explained, "and the numbers continue to progress higher. Broken down by license class, at the end of March there were 14,352 Novices, 343,597 Technicians, 161,220 Generals, 57,393 Advanced and 127,674 Amateur Extra licensees. It's an all-time high for Technician, General and Extra class licensees, as well. Additionally, our total number of licensees across all three NTS CW Nets classes has grown each year."

For the first quarter of 2012, Somma said that the ARRL VEC test session statistics are the highest first quarter results since the FCC's restructuring of the license requirements in 2007: "Our exam session activity and exam elements administered are elevated. As the total number of licensees across all three license classes continues to grow each year, the demand for Amateur Radio exam sessions also grows. In turn, the number of amateurs who want to be Volunteer Examiners and who want to teach Amateur Radio classes is also rising. The ARRL VEC has seen a spike in the number of applications from General and Extra class radio amateurs who want to give back to their community by serving as examiners and instructors. This is a positive trend that we expect will continue over the coming months." 04/11/2012
