Top Operator Awards


SK - Paul W. Copeland, K4KCS, one of our 13 Colonies operators from North Carolina, has made his final QSO.

Starting with 2012's special event, an award plaque will be instituted, for Colony Operators only, in his memory.

1.) Top Operator HF-High Power-over 250 watts to legal limit.

2.) Top Operator HF-Low Power-250 watts and below.

3.) Top Operator-Satellite.



The award will be affixed to a black-real hardwood plaque 10" x 13" with a clear Lucite facing and has beveled edges.

The award is annual each year with slight variations for contrast. It will be issued on July 31st, and mailed out to the recipients. The image above shows only the certificate that will go on the plaque. I wish I could give everyone this plaque, it is well deserved. It serves as an incentive. I know we will make Paul proud. Believe me, it will be something that you folks will have no reservation placing on your shack wall. This award is for individual efforts only. The only exemption is OM/XYL teams because they operate separately as one station. Club members are eligible, individually.

Paul was a God fearing man, Patriotic, a serious ham radio enthusiast and a joy to know/talk

Vanity Call Sign Fee Increases September 4



On August 3, the FCC announced via a Final Rule in the Federal Register that the cost of an Amateur Radio vanity call sign will increase 80 cents, from

to \$14.20 to \$15. The new fees take effect 30 days after publication, making September 4, 2012, the first day the new fee is in effect. Earlier this year, the FCC released a Notice of Proposed Rulemaking and Order (NPRM), seeking to raise the fee for Amateur Radio vanity call signs.

The vanity call sign regulatory fee is payable not only when applying for a new vanity call sign, but also upon renewing a vanity call sign for a new 10 year term. The first vanity call sign licenses issued under the current Amateur Radio vanity call sign program that began in 1996 came up for renewal six years ago. ARRL Videos

The program for the August meeting will be the ARRL film The Hams Wide World that was produced in 1969. It is the first of six videos produced by Emmy winning Hollywood Producer and Director Dave Bell, W6AQ. He introduces and comments at the end of each video. Dave is in the process of writing a book abut his history and experiences in Amateur Radio and he has it on the Internet at http://www.worldsbesthobby.com/. He starts off the book when he was 14 in 1946 when he first found out about Amateur Radio. It is very entertaining and has some funny experiences. When I first read it a few months ago, I couldn't wait to get back to it when I ran out of time. He had 18 chapters then and is now up to 20. He recently finished Chapter 20 and posted it in late July.

If you are coming to the next meeting on August 14, be sure to jump to chapter 20 that he just posted and read it. He tells of his experiences in the making of the film that will be shown at the meeting. It will give you an insight of how it was done and his contacts with Senator Barry K4LIB, in the making of the film.

K6CJV in his wheelchair is shown talking to the KC4USX in the Antarctica running a phone patch. I use to do the same in 1958-59 but what fascinated me was the equipment K6CJV was using. He was using a Hallicrafters HT-32 SSB transmitter and a Collins 75A4 receiver. On top of the HT-32 was a Heathkit DX-100 AM transmitter. I had all 3 of those in the late '50's, but sold the DX-100 when I got the HT-32.




