Bill Finch, W4EHF, 101, SK



Bill Finch, W4EHF, passed away July 27, 2013. He was 101 years old and a very active Life Member of the Brightleaf ARC. Bill had been an Amateur Radio operator for 78 years and was licensed in 1935. He upgraded to Amateur Extra Class when he was 94 in 2005. Bill's son, Bill Finch, Jr., AI4TN, is also a member of BARC.

The funeral service was conducted July 30 at 11 a.m. at the First Presbyterian Church, Greenville. The family received friends at the church prior to the service. A graveside service was held July 31 at 11 a.m. in Lafayette Memorial Park, Favetteville.

Bill was awarded the Order of the Long Leaf Pine by Governor Beverly Perdue for his service to Amateur Radio and his work in emergency communications and radio nets. Bill was still active in the traffic nets every week. It was presented to him by North Carolina Section

Manager Bill Morine, N2COP, at the RARSFest April 7, 2012 at the beginning of the ARRL Division meeting.

Bill had a few remarks at the end of the ceremony thanking everyone for their help and about his love of North Carolina even when he was away. Bill remarked that he was born in Raleigh and always looked forward to returning to North Carolina even though he was not gone for long. Years ago while in New York, he memorized the North Carolina toast and recited it in his comments. The first 4 lines are on the certificate that he received.

Bill went to college at the University of North Carolina majoring in Education. He got a job as a technical writer for the Army in 1946 at Ft. Bragg and stayed there until his retirement in 1975. His job on the Airborne, Electronics and Special Warfare Review Board entailed designing tests to see if communications and electronic equipment met Army specifications and reporting the test results. After "retiring", the next week he became the Director of the Cumberland County Civil Defense and retired again in 1982.

Bill was very active in BARC going to almost all meetings and participating in public service events supported by BARC. He enjoyed operating in nets.

He also was in the Senior Olympics and holds the World Record for the 1500 meter run in the 95-99 year age group. He also holds state and national records in the 800 and 1500 meter runs. 



Tom Christian, VP6TC/VR6TC, Silent Key, Pitcairn Island



Tom Christian, VP6RC/VR6TC a long-time radio amateur who became known as "the Voice of Pitcairn," died July 7 on the tiny South Pacific Island that was his lifelong home. He was 78 and a descendent of Fletcher Christian of "Mutiny on the Bounty" fame. In 2009 he was diagnosed with possible Alzheimer's disease. According to his wife Betty, VP6YL/ VR6YL, his health "deteriorated all too quickly," and the last few months were, in her words, "cruel ones to watch such a strong, vibrant man reduced to where he was not really aware of his surroundings and then was unable to walk and swallow food or liquid."

Tom was first licensed in 1957. Over the years, he and Betty kept in routine radio contact with their ham radio friends overseas as well as with two of their daughters who are hams. He often ran just 70 W into a 250 foot wire on 15 meters and was able to work the US easily. Tom was buried July 8 in the cemetery on Pitcairn. He was a Member of the British Empire (M.B.E), and served for 40 years on the Pitcairn Island Council as the Governor's Representative. 




