



Also questionable are XV8LNS on 20 meters (JT65), XV2PC on 15 meters (PSK31), XV2PTEOTL on 15 meters (PSK31), and XV2M on 20 meters (JT65 and SSB). The Daily DX says other call signs believed to be pirates are XV3DCM, 3W2LGY, and

3W4RJF. In addition someone has been using the call sign XV2T on 15 meters CW, but the real XV2T does not operate CW. - via
