#### **JOTA Reports 36% Growth in Scout Participation**

Scouting's Jamboree on the Air (JOTA) 2018 reports that total Scout participation in the annual fall event jumped by 36% from 2017. Each year more than 1 million Scouts and Guides get together over the airwaves for JOTA, which takes place on the third weekend of October. Since the first JOTA in 1958, millions of Scouts have become acquainted via Amateur Radio, and contacts sometimes result in relationships that extend for many years.

This year, 10,703 Scouts took part in the event, compared with 7,872 last year. Participating Amateur Radio operators topped 1,000 for the first time since 2016. At 610, the number of registered JOTA locations was way up, as was the number of JOTA stations registered, with 314. Participating JOTA stations reported contacts with stations in 99 countries, also up over 2017.

JOTA Coordinator Jim Wilson, K5ND, said he was pleased with this year's numbers and hopes that 2019's event will show a continued increase, despite a lack of sunspots.

"Looking over the numbers, a big part of the increase in JOTA Scout participation came from the World JOTA-JO-TI (Jamboree on the Internet) Team's registration and reporting system," Wilson told ARRL. "We had 233 stations report results on the US system, which is comparable to last year's 226. In addition to that, 90 stations reported their results on the World system. After eliminating duplicates, this added 33 to our total of 266 station reports.

That, chiefly, accounts for the increase in total Scout participation. In summary, perhaps this nice increase is due primarily to more accurate reporting."

Wilson said he's also looking forward to the final tally on US participation in JOTI. "Location registration in the US jumped from 274 last year to 610 this year," he said. "Several Amateur Radio operations reported using JOTI chat and Skype to greatly improve their ability to generate Scout-to-Scout conversations between the US and the rest of the world. Of course, VoIP modes like D-Star, DMR, and EchoLink also helped in our solar minimum."

World JOTA-JOTI numbers are not expected until early 2019, as each country reports its results by mid-December followed by number crunching and compiling of the report, Wilson explained.

"Thanks to everyone who set up a JOTA station and helped Scouts experience the technology, fun, and magic of Amateur Radio. Let's do it again next year," he concluded.



#### **Checking 811A Tubes**

If anyone has a tube tester that tests 811A tubes, I would like to check out a few. I have about 5 or 6 that I need to test and I'm sure some are okay but just want to be sure which ones. I use four of them in my Collins 30L-1 and just put in a new set after one shorted and burned out a resister and capacitor. Replaced the parts and ordered four new ones for the amplifier. It works fine again just like it did when I got it over 57 years ago. It's still a great amplifier putting out about 600 watts. #### IS BIG BROTHER IS WATCHING?

Following is a recent story that caught my attention. A report from BuzzFeed News, November 16,2018:

Facebook has submitted a patent application for technology that would predict who your family and other household members are, based on images and captions posted to Facebook, as well as your device information, like shared IP addresses. The application, titled "Predict-

ing household demographics based on image data," was originally filed May 10, 2017, and madepublic today (November 15, 2018). The system Facebook proposes in its patent application would use facial recognition and learning models trained to understand text to help Facebook better understand whom you live with and interact with most. The technology described in the patent looks for clues in your profile pictures on Facebook and Instagram, as well as photos of you that you or your friends post.

It would note the people identified in a photo, and how frequently the people are included in your pictures. Then, it would assess information from comments on the photos, captions, or tags (#family, #mom, #kids) -- anything that indicates whether someone is a husband, daughter, cousin, etc. -- to predict what your family/household actually looks like. According to the patent application, Facebook's prediction models would also analyze "messaging history, past tagging history, [and] web browsing history" to see if multiple people share IP addresses (a unique identifier for every internet net-

A Facebook spokesperson said in response to the story, "We often seek patents for technology we never implement, and patents should not be taken as an indication of future plans."

I wonder what's next since we now have cell phones and newer cars have computers following our movements and cameras in stores and on streets watching us.

## California Radio Amateur Receives Notice of Unlicensed Operation from FCC

The FCC Enforcement Bureau on November 7 issued a Notice of Unlicensed Operation (NoUO) to Technician licensee Daryl Thomas, KE6MWS, of Carmichael, California, for allegedly operating an unlicensed FM radio station.

On October 10, 2018, an Enforcement Bureau agent from the FCC's San Francisco Office responded to a complaint of an unlicensed FM station operating on 95.7 MHz in Carmichael. The agent confirmed by direction-finding techniques that a signal on 95.7 MHz was emanating from a residence, and Thomas subsequently admitted that he was the operator of this station, the FCC said in the NoUO.

The agent measured the field strength of the signal found that it exceeded the maximum permitted level of 250  $\mu$ V per meter at 3 meters, established under Part 15.

The Notice cautioned Thomas that operation of radio transmitting equipment without a valid radio station authorization, or in violation of the Commission's RF radiation limits, constitutes a violation of the federal laws cited above and could subject the operator to severe penalties, including, but not limited to, substantial monetary fines, in rem seizure of the offending radio equipment, and criminal sanctions including imprisonment.

"Unlicensed operation of this radio station must be discontinued immediately and must not resume," the Notice warned.





## FCC Rejects 2004 AMSAT Petition to Reconsider Applying Orbital Debris Rules to Ham Satellites

The FCC has rejected a Petition for Reconsideration that AMSAT filed 14 years ago, seeking to exempt **Amateur Radio satellites** from the FCC's satellite orbital debris mitigation requirements. The Commission took the opportunity in a Notice of Proposed Rulemaking and Order on Reconsideration, released on November 19, that revisits its orbital debris rules for the first time since their adoption in 2004. Among other things, AMSAT had argued at the time of its Petition that applying the orbital debris requirements to Amateur Radio satellites would be cost prohibitive, and that the FCC had not indicated what constitutes an acceptable orbital debris mitigation plan.

Acknowledging that time has made some of AMSAT's arguments moot, the FCC said the costs involved with modifications to comply with post-mission disposal requirements "are justified when balanced against the public interest in mitigating orbital debris." The FCC said it determined that closer adherence to the disposal methods described in

the rules was "warranted in order to limit the growth of orbital debris" in low-Earth orbit (LEO).

"In any event, in the years since the debris mitigation rules were adopted, and notwithstanding any costs imposed by FCC regulations, well over 150 small satellites have been authorized, with at least 20 of those considered amateur satellites," the FCC said in its November 15 Order on Reconsideration. "It appears that, to the extent that any costs have been incurred, the main contributor to costs for amateur and similar LEO missions has to do with the availability of launches to appropriate orbits."

The FCC also said that in the years since the FCC issued its Orbital Debris Order, "numerous licensees, including amateur satellites operating in LEO, have successfully satisfied our orbital debris mitigation requirements.

AMSAT released a statement on the dismissal of its reconsideration petition.

"For nearly 60 years, Amateur Radio hobbyists, experimenters, and researchers from AMSAT. other Amateur Radio organizations, and universities worldwide have pioneered numerous satellite technologies, including inter-satellite communication links, search-and-rescue satellite systems (SARSAT), reception of GPS signals at altitudes above the GPS constellation, and the use of commercial off-the-shelf components in space while accomplishing this with smaller and smaller satellites. We look forward to working with the FCC to craft a regulatory framework that addresses the growing concerns regarding orbital debris while preserving the flexibility for hobbyists, experimenters, and researchers to access a variety of orbits."
