Sandy proved: When all else failed, amateur radio worked Published: Saturday, December 01, 2012 By L. James Biddle By Jim Biddle

While Delaware County was severely visited by Sandy, this hurricane did extensive damage in neighboring New Jersey.

Knowing one of the characteristics of Amateur Radio where its signals know no boundaries, a collection of Delaware County Amateur Radio operators were on standby.

This local cooperative effort began by monitoring the shortwave, long distance communications from the International Hurricane Net.

Walter Faust, N3FXR, president of the Marple Newtown Amateur Radio Club, explained the function of this well-focused Ham Radio group,

"They provided information from the danger areas to the outside world. When radio waves leave a transmitter they don't always go where they wanted. When they don't, Amateur Radio operators in areas like Delaware County provide a relay to the original target area."

As the storm advanced toward the New Jersey shore, different radios and different monitoring and possible relay techniques were employed by local Amateur Radio operators.

Faust explained, "New Jersey's vulnerability to storms like Sandy provides a large amount of potential work for area Amateur Radio operators.

"Using equipment that provides a more localized coverage, the need for relaying information is lessened. Yet, Delaware County Amateur Radio operators like East Lansdowne's Gary Bodnar, K3GZ, continued to provide backup assistance."

Local Amateur Radio operator Jim Biddle, W3DCL explained, "It is not uncommon in emergencies for Amateur Radio operators to make long distance telephone calls to a police, fire, or medical emergency dispatch point when a local call cannot be completed because of downed lines in the area of the emergency.

Borrowing a phrase that describes Amateur Radio's emergency capabilities, Biddle shared, "When all else fails, Amateur Radio works."
