
Yuma HamFest 2016 Jack Eyster – KO6V

Then we got to test our creation, and got a little practice attempting to find three beginner transmitters on 144.525 MHz, located on the fairgrounds.

The vendor hall had a great selection of vendors, with Elecraft, Palomar, DX Store, and HRO among the more notable ones. In the back of the vendor hall, was a consignment area with some fantastic deals. And outside in the tailgating section, some really nice treasures waiting for some lucky ham. Oh, if only my lottery numbers would come up!



The ARRL 2016 Field Day rules have come out, and they have a new bonus point category related to Social Media:

Rule 7.3.16 Social Media offers 100 bonus points for promoting your Field Day activation to the general public via an active, recognized, and utilized social media platform, such as Facebook, Twitter, or Instagram. This bonus is available to bona fide Amateur Radio clubs and Field Day groups that welcome visitors to their operations. These bonus points are not available to individual participants, and club websites do not qualify as social media for this bonus. The bonus points are available to all Field Day entry classes meeting the criteria.

With this new category, I am pleased to announce a SFVARC logo contest. We are looking for members to submit logo's that we can use to create a presence on Social Media pages, website, shirts, etc. The deadline for entries is May 1st, and the membership will vote on the submitted entries at the May 20th meeting.
